FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

JULY 1964

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1964.

INTRODUCTION:

Total Federal Government staff, including employees of corporations and agencies, numbered 354,269 at the end of July 1964. This was an increase of 1.8 p.c. or 6,428 over June and 1.1 p.c. or 3,793 over July 1963.

They earned a total of \$145,411,000 for the month. This represented a 1.8 p.c. or \$2,593,000 increase over June but a 5.0 p.c. or \$7,680,000 decrease from July 1963. The 5.0 p.c. decrease occurred mainly because retroactive payments were substantially lower in the current month, than during July 1963.

Aggregate earnings for the January - July period increased from \$944,174,000 in 1963 to \$967,-735,000 in 1964.

The quarterly statement of hirings and separations data for salaried employees in the second quarter of 1964 is given in Table 10 of this issue.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

There were 143,717 employees in this group at the end of July 1964, representing a 2.5 p.c. increase or 3,491 more employees than at the end of June 1964.

July 1964 earnings of the group amounted to \$64,629,000, an increase over the previous month of 1.9 p.c. or \$1,202,000. July 1963 earnings were \$63,163,000 for a staff of 141,611.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

This departmental group staffed by 210,552 at the end of July, had a personnel increase of 1.4 p.c. or 2,937 employees over the previous month and less than one per cent, or 1,687 over July 1963.

Earnings, totalling \$80,782,000, were slightly higher than June earnings but were 10.2 p.c. or \$9,150,000 below the comparable figure for July a year ago. As noted in the Introduction, total earnings for July 1963 included the payment of retroactive salary increases.

The principal variations in staff strength at the end of July 1964, when compared to June are outlined in the following table:

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication.

The table shows for the three month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (pertaining to hirings and separations).

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by an asterick). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

When using this table the following points should be remembered:

1. "Hiring" means the initial appointment of a person to the reporting department or an appointment from a non-Act to an Act position.
2. "Separation" means the termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service, by transfer to another "department", or transfer from an Act to a non-Act position. Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations.
3. "Department", for this table only, is altered to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.

Variations in this particular quarterly summary are mainly seasonal increases due to the beginning of spring activities. The most significant ones are listed below together with the function of each group, and the reason for the change.
