#### OCTOBER 1965

#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1965.

## INTRODUCTION:

Departments, corporations and other agencies of the Federal Government were staffed by 347.5 thousand civilian employees at October 31, 1965. This was a decrease of 1.9 p.c. from September 30, 1965 but was 1.9 p.c. over October 31, 1964.

The October 1965 payroll of \$154.0 million was down a substantial 11.9 p.c. from September 1965, due to a reduction in retroactive payments as explained in the Commentary re Part B of this report (see page 7 ). The October payroll was up \$10.9 million or 7.6 p.c. from October 1964.

Payroll from January through October aggregated \$1.41 billion in 1964 and \$1.50 billion in 1965, an increase of 6.5 p.c. The April 1 to October 31 cumulative payroll increased 7.0 p.c., from \$1.01 billion in 1964 to \$1.08 billion in 1965.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

There were 139.1 thousand employees in these organizations at the end of October 1965, a decline of 2.9 p.c. or 4.0 thousand from September but 0.7 p.c. or 0.9 thousand employees above October 1964.

Total payroll of \$66.6 million was \$0.6 million or 0.9 p.c. below the previous month, but \$3.8 million or 6.0 p.c. above the October 1964 pay of \$62.9 million.

The comparison of September-October payroll indicates a seasonal drop in payroll of those corporations in the transportation industry, a rise in payroll of those in the communications industry, and minor changes in payroll of those in other industries.

Cumulative payroll from January 1 to October 31, 1965 was \$649.6 million, compared to \$611.4 million for the same period of 1964. Payroll was \$465.6 million for seven months (April 1 to October 31) of the 1965-66 Fiscal year and \$441.2 million for the same seven months of 1964.

## PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Emergency Measures Organization was transferred from the Department of Defence Production to the Department of Industry, effective June 8, 1965. Commencing with this issue a footnote will indicate this transfer of administrative responsibilities and starting with the April 1966 publication, it will be listed as part of the Department of Industry.

The departmental organizations covered in Part B of this publication employed 208.4 thousand people at the end of October 1965. There was a minor decrease of 1.3 p.c. in total employment from the end of September, attributable mainly to a seasonal decline in casual staff. The October 1965 staff strength was up 3.1 p.c. from October 1964.

Total October payroll at \$87.4 million was 18.7 p.c. less than September (\$107.5 million). This difference resulted mainly from a drop of some \$19.4 million in retroactive payments. Comment appears in the September issue regarding the inclusion therein of substantial retroactive payments. In addition, a small decrease of 1.0 p.c. occurred in regular payroll as a result of reduced casual payroll.

Cumulative payroll of \$853.4 million for the first ten months of 1965 was 6.7 p.c. greater than the payroll for the like period of 1964. Aggregate payroll April through October was \$612.6 million in 1965 as opposed to \$566.5 million in 1964, an increase of 8.1 p.c.

Third quarter 1965

#### Comments:

Seasonal variations normally account for most changes in hirings and separations from quarter to quarter. For example, in the Department of Agriculture hirings are high in the second quarter because of the establishment and maintenance of spring projects. Seasonal activities in the agriculture field keep hirings up in the third quarter. Completion of agricultural activities in the fourth quarter results in a sharp decline in hirings. On the other hand, separations are low in the first and second quarters, high in the third, and taper off in the fourth.

Initiation of new programs in various departments, changes in organizational structure, and other non-seasonal variations frequently occur. The most notable during the third quarter of 1965 are:

## Notes and Definitions

#### Notes:

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication, presenting data covering the previous quarter. The table shows for each three-month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees, (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by \*). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

## Definitions:

- 1. <u>Hiring</u>: The initial appointment of a person to the reporting "department" whether as a new employee in the Government Service or by transfer from another "department". Movements within a department are not considered as hirings. For purposes of hirings and separations only, the term "department" as used above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.
- 2. Separation: The termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transfer to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations. For purposes of hirings and separations only, the term "department" as used above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.
- 3. Average employment: As used in the table on hirings and separations represents the mean monthly average number of employees in each "department" during the quarter.
- 4. Monthly average (as pertains to hirings and separations): represents the arithmetic mean i.e. one third of the actual hirings and separations for the quarter.
- 5. Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (as pertains to hirings and separations); the rate is computed by the following formula:
