

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1965.

INTRODUCTION:

December 1965 civilian employment and payrolls of the Canadian Government were almost unchanged from November 1965. Total employment was down to 344.7 thousand from 346.1 thousand in November. December payroll was \$155.2 million. The current month exceeded December 1964 in both numbers (2.0 p.c.) and payrolls (7.4 p.c.).

Federal payroll for 1965 was \$1.81 billion, versus \$1.69 billion in 1964, a 7.4 p.c. increase. Between 1 and 2 p.c. of this resulted from a continuing gradual increase in the number of persons employed while the remaining 5 to 6 p.c. increase was due to salary revisions. The same two factors are evident in the April to December 1965 payroll of \$1.39 billion which was up 7.3 p.c. from \$1.29 billion paid in the same period of 1964.

Although monthly changes have not significantly altered total employment or payrolls, a few noteworthy changes did occur within individual organizations. Remarks relating to these can be found in the commentaries re Part A (page 6) and Part B (page 7).

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

Total December 1965 employment (136.7 thousand) and payrolls (\$66.8 million) of Crown Corporations included in Table 2 (Part A), changed only slightly from November 1965. The month-to-month comparison indicated a decrease of 0.6 p.c. in numbers and 1.6 p.c. in dollars; the year-to-year comparison indicated employment was up 0.7 p.c. and payroll 4.7 p.c.

Seasonal declines in staff strength occurred in those corporations involved in transportation activities.

Payments were higher than normal due to several factors: (a) Some corporations made lump sum payments for overtime and retroactive salary adjustments, (b) An extra pay period for staff of Polymer Corp. occurred because there were three fortnightly paydays instead of the normal two. (Note: Air Canada payroll in December was lower than in November because the third fortnightly pay occurred in the earlier month).

Annual payroll was \$784 million in 1965 and \$738 million in 1964, up 6.3 p.c. Payroll April to December was \$600 million in 1965 and \$568 million in 1964, up 5.7 p.c. These payroll increases can be attributed to salary revisions and additions to staff; no organizational units with sizeable payroll were added to or deleted from the coverage of this publication during the year.

Over 90 p.c. of the total payroll was accounted for by: (1) Canadian National Railways, (2) Air Canada, (3) Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, (4) Polymer Corporation, (5) Atomic Energy of Canada Limited and (6) National Harbours Board. Their combined payroll was \$715.7 million in 1965, up 6.2 p.c. from that of 1964 (\$674.1 million).

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Only minor changes occurred in the staff strength and payrolls of these organizations between November and December 1965. The employee count at 208.1 thousand and total payroll at \$88.4 million were virtually unchanged from November. However, compared to December 1964, numbers were 2.9 p.c. greater and payroll 9.6 p.c. more.

A functional analysis of the data indicates the following fluctuations in employment: "Highways, Roads and Bridges" down 6.1 p.c. and "Waterways" down 4.4 p.c. There was a 13.1 p.c. drop in "Fish and Game" employment, while that under "Aid to Unemployed Employables" increased 4.8 p.c.

Payroll for the calendar year was \$1.03 billion in 1965, up 7.2 p.c. from the 1964 payroll of \$0.96 billion. The April to December payroll aggregated \$789 million in 1965 as opposed to \$727 million in 1964, an 8.5 p.c. increase. General salary revisions which increased departmental payrolls are reported in the September 1964 publication involving some 63,000 salaried employees, in the April 1965 publication for another 2,700 salaried personnel, and in September 1965 for approximately 62,000 salaried staff. Each of these salary increases has a continuing effect on federal government payroll.
