#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1965.

#### INTRODUCTION:

Civilian staff strength of the Federal Government, including its agencies and corporations, was 356 thousand in July 1965. This was 2 p.c. more than the June 1965 strength of 350 thousand and 1 p.c. greater than the July 1964 strength of 353 thousand.

Total payroll of these employees was \$153 million for July 1965, up 3 p.c. from \$148 million in June 1965 and 6 p.c. from \$145 million in July 1964. About 60 p.c. of the payroll increase over June 1965 is accounted for by the Part A Corporations and Agencies, see page 6.

Cumulative payroll for January 1 to July 31 was \$1,021 million in the 1965 period and \$967 million in the 1964 period. Payroll for the first four months of the 1965-66 fiscal year was \$596 million, up \$33 million, or 6 p.c., from the first four months of the previous fiscal year.

#### PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

Staff strength of this group was 144 thousand at the end of July 1965, 3 thousand (5 p.c.) more than the previous month and virtually the same as in July 1964. Total monthly payroll increased to \$68.6 million from \$65.6 million in June 1965 and \$64.6 million in July 1964. Most of these corporations and agencies had increases in both the numbers employed and the payrolls paid.

The increase in Part A payroll from June to July is mainly attributable to a 7 p.c. rise in the payroll expenditure of Canadian National Railways. A substantial decrease (29 p.c.) in the National Harbours Board payroll, due to the continuation of the employee strike, did not significantly affect the total Part A payroll.

Cumulative payroll for January 1 to July 31, 1965 was \$448 million compared with \$416 million in the same period of 1964. Payrolls for the first four months of the 1965-66 fiscal year amounted to \$264 million, \$18 million more than for the same four months of 1964-65.

## PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employees of this group numbered 212 thousand at the end of July 1965. This represents increases of 1 p.c. over both June 1965 and July 1964. The total payroll (\$84.7 million) was 2 p.c. above June 1965 and 5 p.c. over July 1964 due to a rise in regular payrolls.

The function - "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, Beaches and Other Recreational Areas", employed 23 p.c. more people on the last day of July than the last day of June. This increase occured among seasonal employees of National Parks.

Cumulative January 1 to July 31 payroll was \$573 million in 1965 and \$551 million in 1964. This is an increase of \$22 million, or 4 p.c. Cumulative payroll April 1 to July 31 was \$333 million in 1965, up 5 p.c. or \$16 million from \$317 million payroll for the same period of 1964.

The table shows for the three month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by \*). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

The following definitions apply to this table:

- 1. "Hiring" means the appointment of a person to a salaried position (as defined in the April, 1965, publication). Movements within a department are not considered as hirings.
- 2. "Separation" means the termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transferring to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations.
- 3. "Department", for this table only, is altered to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.

### Comments:

- 1. Fisheries seasonal hiring of Fishery Wardens, mainly during April.
- Dominion Bureau of Statistics seasonal hiring of permanent and term professional staff, mainly in June.
