

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

AUGUST 1965

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1965.

INTRODUCTION:

Federal government departments, corporations and agencies employed a civilian staff in excess of 357,000 persons at the end of August 1965. This was slightly greater than in July 1965, and 1 p.c. above August 31, 1964.

Payroll for the month totalled \$153 million, virtually the same as July but \$9.9 million (7 p.c.) above the previous August. Cumulative payroll for the first eight months of 1965 amounted to \$1.2 billion, 6 p.c. above the same period of 1964, while aggregated payroll for April 1 to August 31 of the 1965-66 fiscal year was \$750 million, 6 p.c. higher than for 1964-65.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

There was little change during August in either the number of employees or the payroll of this group. Staff strength increased by 658 to 145,000 while the total payroll decreased \$0.4 million to \$68.2 million. This slight decrease was due mainly to fewer 'holiday' payments during August than in the previous month.

There was a slight increase in employees over August 1964 but a \$4.6 million or 7 p.c. increase in payroll.

Cumulative payroll for the period January 1 to August 31, 1965 amounted to \$515.8 million, compared to \$479.9 million for the same period in 1964. For the first five months of the 1965-66 fiscal year the payroll amounted to \$331.8 million, compared to \$309.7 million in the same five months of 1964-65.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employees of this group totalled more than 212,700 at the end of August 1965. This was slightly more than July and almost 4,700 (2 p.c.) above August 1964.

Total payroll of \$85.1 million was slightly above July and \$5.3 million (7 p.c.) over August a year ago. Payroll increases occurred mainly in regular payroll, although in August salaried employees of the Fisheries Research Board and National Research Council were paid \$279,000 in payments retroactive to October 1, 1965.

January 1 to August 31 payroll amounted to \$658.6 million in 1965, up 4 p.c. from \$630.4 million in the eight months of 1964. Payroll totalled \$417.8 million for the first five months of this fiscal year up 5 p.c. when compared to \$396.8 million for the April 1-August 31, 1964 period.
