Various departmental reorganizations were announced by the Prime Minister in a press release dated December 18, 1965. Several changes were effective January 1st; however, sufficient detail of the position transfers involved was not available in time for the tables of this publication to be adjusted.

#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1965.

#### INTRODUCTION:

The Federal Government, including its corporations, employed a civilian staff of 344.7 thousand in January 1966, virtually unchanged from December 1965 but 2.3 p.c. above January 1965. The month-to-month comparison of payrolls indicates a 7.8 p.c. increase to \$165.5 million and the year-to-year comparison shows a 16.8 p.c. gain over the January 1965 payroll of \$141.8 million. Payroll increases have resulted from general salary revisions for some 62,000 employees (see page seven of this publication and also the September 1965 report).

Payroll aggregated \$1.56 billion from April 1965 to January 1966 inclusive and \$1.44 billion for the same months of 1964-65. The increase was 8.3 p.c.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

But planuary 1966 employment of these corporations was 136.0 thousand, we very slightly from December 1965 and 1.6 p.c. or 2.2 thousand from January 1965 (133.8 thousand). Monthly payroll at \$66.0 million was down 1.1 p.c. from the December payroll (\$66.8 million) gained 7.0 p.c. over January 1965 (\$61.7 million).

Cumulative payroll April 1965 to January 1966 was \$666.3 million, up 5.9 p.c. from the \$629.4 million paid in the comparable period of 1964-65.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employment of these organizations was 208.7 thousand in January 1966, up 0.3 p.c. from December 1965 and 2.8 p.c. from January 1965 (203.0 thousand). Total payroll at \$99.4 million was up 12.5 p.c. from the \$88.4 million payroll of December and 24.3 p.c. from the \$80.0 million for January 1965.

Retroactive salary increases accounted for most of this payroll increase. Some 19,000 professional and technical employees received approximately \$4.2 million for the period July 1 to December 31, 1965 and 70,000 clerical employees received approximately \$3.3 million for the period October 1 to December 31, 1965. The new rates of pay were used in computing January 1966 payroll statistics.

Total payroll April 1965 through January 1966 was \$888.4 million, a 10.1 p.c. gain over the \$806.8 million payroll of the same ten months in 1964-65.

The function "Public Health" registered a 19.5 p.c. increase, or 200 employees, between December 1965 and January 1966. This reflects the transfer of 200 people from Veterans Affairs (function: Veterans' Pensions and Other Benefits) to National Health and Welfare.

#### Fourth quarter 1965

#### Comments:

A comparison of hiring and separation rates of the fourth-quarter-1965 with those of the third-quarter-1965 and the fourth-quarter-1964, indicates a few noteworthy variations. Hirings in the Civil Service Commission were high with staff added to the "Language Training Section" and the "Bureau of Classification Revision". Hirings increased in the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in preparation for the 1966 population census of Canada. In the fourth quarter acquisition of staff occurred at a high rate in the Department of National Health and Welfare; additions were made generally and not to any particular departmental program.

#### Notes and Definitions

#### Notes:

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication, presenting data covering the previous quarter. The table shows for each three-month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees, (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by \*). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

#### Definitions:

- 1. <u>Hiring</u>: The initial appointment of a person to the reporting "department" whether as a new employee in the Government Service or by transfer from another "department". Movements within a department are not considered as hirings. For purposes of hirings and separations only, the term "department" as used above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.
- 2. <u>Separation</u>: The termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transfer to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations. For purposes of hirings and separations only, the term "department" as used above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.
- 3. Average employment: As used in the table on hiring and separations represents the mean monthly average number of employees in each "department" during the quarter.
- 4. Monthly average (as pertains to hirings and separations): represents the arithmetic mean i.e. one third of the actual hirings and separations for the quarter.
- 5. Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (as pertains to hirings and separations); the rate is computed by the following formula:
