A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1966.

## INTRODUCTION

At the end of October 1966 there were 365.9 thousand employees in the Federal Public Service who earned a total of \$187.8 million. This represented an employee decrease of 6.1 thousand (1.6 p.c.) since September, and a payroll increase of \$18.1 million (10.7 p.c.). Compared to October 1965 there was an increase of 18.4 thousand (5.3 p.c.) and \$33.8 million (22.0 p.c.) respectively.

Payrolls from January through October 1966, amounted to \$1,685 million up \$182 million (12.1 p.c.) from the same period of 1965. In the first seven months of the 1966-67 fiscal year, cumulative payrolls totalled \$1,208 million, 12.0 p.c. above the same seven months of 1965-66.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

There were 143.8 thousand employees in these organizations at the end of October 1966, a decrease of 2.3 thousand (1.6 p.c.) from September but 4.7 thousand (3.4 p.c.) above October 1965.

Total payroll for the month amounted to \$88.2 million, an increase of \$19.0 million (27.5 p.c.) from September and \$22.0 million (32.4 p.c.) above the previous October.

A month-to-month comparison indicates a seasonal employee decrease accompanied by a \$19.0 million payroll increase. Of this amount, \$16.4 million was due to a 4 p.c. pay increase to two different groups of Canadian National Railways employees. The increases were effective January 1, 1966 for one group and June 1 for the second while the total amount of the retroactive pay was reported in October. Overtime and shift premium payments amounting to \$2.6 million to Air Canada employees accounted for the balance.

Cumulative payroll for the ten months, January to October 1966 was \$706.7 million, 8.8 p.c. above the same months of 1965. Payrolls for the period April to October amounted to \$509.8 million, compared to \$465.6 million for the same seven months of 1965.

## PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Employment in this group, Departments and Departmental Corporations, numbered 222.1 thousand at the end of October 1966. This was 3.8 thousand, (1.7 p.c.) below the previous month, but up 13.7 thousand, (6.6 p.c.) from October 1965.

The employee increase, which was a gradual one through the year, occurred mainly in the following departments: National Health and Welfare - where both Health and Welfare Services were expanded; National Revenue - by expansion of the Taxation Division; Post Office - by (1) the inclusion of Semi-Staff employees who were previously "footnoted", (2) a number of new Revenue Post Offices were established in each province; and Transport - particularly in the "Marine" and "Air" Services.

Veterans' Affairs reported a marked decrease in staff, due largely to the transfer of Sunny-brook Hospital to the jurisdiction of the University of Toronto.

Total October payroll at \$99.6 million was down slightly from September 1966, but \$12.3 million (14.0 p.c.) above October 1965.

Cumulative payrolls for the period January 1 to October 31, amounted to \$978.6 million, 14.7 p.c. higher than the same ten months of 1965. Aggregate payrolls April through October was \$698.1 million, 14.0 p.c. above the same period of 1965.

A function analysis of employment between September and October indicated a 13.6 p.c. decrease in the number of 'casuals' employed in the Yukon Territories under "Highways, Roads and Bridges" due to weather conditions at that time. With official recognition of the new department "Manpower and Immigration" October 1, 1966, "Social Welfare - National Employment Service" was combined with "Social Welfare - Labour". Under "Other - Civil Defence" there was a 10.2 p.c. decrease among casuals, following completion of a building project in B.C.

Effective October 1, 1966 the Government announced a number of changes in departmental organization under the "Government Organization Act, 1966". The following table shows that generally speaking, these changes are purely administrative. In one case (Manpower and Immigration) the changes affected functions as indicated below.



#### Third quarter, 1966

#### Comments

Most of the variations in this quarter are seasonal. However, the departmental reorganization which began in December, 1965 has continued with marked effect on some Departments. Those showing the greatest variations, for whatever reason, are shown below:

# Notes and Definitions

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication.

The table shows for the three month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (r) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Dwing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic flactuations to the biring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by 0). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

The following definitions apply to this table:

- "Hiring" means the appointment of a person to a salaried position (as defined on page 48 in the April, 1966, publication). Movements within a department are not considered as hirings.
- "Separation" means the termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transferring to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations.
- "department", for this table only, is altered to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.


