Various departmental reorganizations were announced by the Prime Minister in a press release dated December 18, 1965. Several changes were effective January 1st; however, sufficient detail of the position transfers involved was not available in time for the tables of this publication to be adjusted.

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1965.

INTRODUCTION:

Civilian employment of federal departments and corporations increased from 344.7 thousand in January 1966 to 346.1 thousand in February, a 0.4 p.c. increase. Payroll, on the other hand, was down 7.2 p.c., from \$165.5 million in January to \$153.6 million in February. Commentary on these changes can be found on pages 6 and 7. Staff strength was up 2.8 p.c. and pay 10.3 p.c. from February 1965.

The combined payrolls for January and February were \$319.1 million in 1966, up 13.5 p.c. from the comparable figure of 1965. Payroll aggregated \$1.71 billion in the first eleven months of the 1965-66 fiscal year, a gain of 8.4 p.c. over the \$1.58 billion aggregate payroll for the same period of 1964-65.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

February 1966 employment and payrolls of these activities changed slightly (- 0.1 p.c. and - 3.9 p.c. respectively) from January 1966. The respective changes from February 1965 were + 1.5 p.c., or 2.1 thousand, and + 7.2 p.c., or \$4.39 thousand.

The month-to-month decrease in payroll is accountable to Canadian National Railways. This decline occurred mainly because there were fewer working days in February than January.

Payroll for January plus February was \$129.5 million in 1966, up 7.1 p.c. from 1965. For the first eleven months of the fiscal year, payroll amounted to \$729.8 million in 1965-66, an increase of 6.0 p.c. from 1964-65 (\$688.6 million).

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Departmental staff strength at 210.0 thousand in February 1966 was 0.7 p.c. greater than that of January 1966 and 3.7 p.c. more than February 1965. Regular payroll for the month under review was \$87.5 million, a decrease of 0.7 p.c. from January but up 12.3 p.c. from February a year ago.

The month-to-month drop in total payroll was 9.4 p.c., or \$9.3 million, reflecting a substantial reduction in retroactive payments from some \$8.0 million in January (pay associated with the general salary revisions reported in the January issue of this publication) to approximately \$400 thousand in February. In addition, post-Christmas overtime of regular salaried staff of the Canada Post Office in January, costing some \$1.9 million, was \$1.4 million more than the February overtime pay to these employees.

Total payroll for the first two months of 1966 was \$189.6 million, up 18.4 p.c. from that of 1965. Cumulative payroll April to February was \$978 million for the period ending February 28, 1966 and \$887 million for the period ending in 1965.


