#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1966.

## INTRODUCTION:

Civilian employment in the Public Service increased from 360,565 in May to 367,093 (+ 1.8 p.c.) at the end of June 1966. Payrolls were up from \$166.9 million for May to \$168.8 million for June, an increase of 1.1 p.c. In June 1965, there were 349,622 employees earning \$148.4 million, thus there were year-to-year increases of 5.0 p.c. and 13.7 p.c. respectively.

Cumulative payrolls for January - June were \$979.5 million, 12.9 p.c. above the same period of 1965. For the first three-months of the fiscal year (April - June) payrolls amounted to \$502.0 million, compared to \$443.0 million for the first quarter of 1965-66.

# PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

At the end of June staff strength totalled 145,242 employees and payroll for the month amounted to \$71.6 million. Changes from May included, an increase of 3,597 (2.5 p.c.) in staff and a payroll decrease of \$170.0 thousand (0.2 p.c.). Respective changes from June 1965 were plus 4,288 employees (3.0 p.c.) and plus \$6.1 million (9.3 p.c.).

A number of activities in fields such as transportation and construction required either additional staff, or a considerable increase in the number of hours worked with a corresponding increase in the payrolls. In mid-June the National Harbours Board's 39-day strike ended and their month closed showing the usual number of employees. In addition to seasonal activities, holiday grants to employees on vacation and retroactive payments were higher than normal.

Air Canada pays its employees on a fortnightly basis. This means that the Company reports two pay periods for ten months of each year, while the remaining two months contain three. As a result of the extra pay period May payroll was greater than June.

Cumulative payrolls for the first six months of 1966 were \$406.8 million, up 7.3 p.c. from 1965. For the period April to June, payrolls amounted to \$209.9 million, compared to \$195.0 million for the same three months of 1965-66.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES:

Employment in this group at 221,851 was 2,931 (1.3 p.c.) above May and 13,183 (6.3 p.c.) more than for June 1965. The greatest increase, 2,046 (69.8 p.c. of the total gain), was in "Casuals and Others" reflecting the employment of students for summer projects.

Gross payrolls were up \$2.0 million to \$97.2 million, slightly above the previous month and 14.8 p.c. more than a year ago. This rise resulted mainly from retroactive payments of \$1.5 million to certain classes of technical employees.

Aggregate payrolls for the first six months of 1966 amounted to \$572.7 million, 17.2 p.c. more than for 1965. For the April 1 - June 30 quarter payrolls totalled \$292.1 million compared to \$248.0 million for April to June, 1965.

This section of the publication reports a transfer of approximately 1,570 salaried employees from Citizenship and Immigration to Northern Affairs and National Resources. This included the Indian Affairs Branch in its entirety, plus a few employees from Departmental Administration.

A function analysis of employment between May and June revealed these changes: (1) "Other: - Civil Defence": an increase of casual employees in the Emergency Planning Division of Public Works.

(2) "International Co-operation and Assistance": External Aid Office required additional salaried and casual employees to handle the unusually large number of foreign students entering Canada on Fellowships and Scholarships. The initial welfare and training of these students is the direct responsibility of this Branch. (3) "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Forests": Forestry shows an increase of 373 (29.8 p.c.) casual employees - which is a May seasonal gain but due to late reporting the increase appeared in this issue.
