#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

#### JULY 1966

#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1966.

#### INTRODUCTION

Total civilian employment in the Federal Public Service at the end of July 1966 was 372.9 thousand, an increase of 6.3 thousand (1.7 p.c.) over June and 17.0 thousand (4.8 p.c.) greater than in July 1965.

The monthly payroll at \$172.0 million was \$3.2 million (1.9 p.c.) above the June payroll and 12.2 p.c. greater than the previous July.

Cumulative payrolls for the first seven months of 1966 totalled \$1.15 billion (12.8 p.c.) greater than in the same period of 1965. In four months of the current fiscal year, (April 1 - July 31) payrolls amounted to \$674.0 million, 13.0 p.c. above the same months of 1965-66.

#### PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Staff strength of this group totalled 149 thousand employees at the end of July 1966, 3.8 thousand (2.6 p.c.) more than the previous month, and 5.1 thousand (3.5 p.c.) above July 1965. Total payroll for the month amounted to \$74.4 million, an increase of \$2.8 million (3.8 p.c.) from June and \$5.8 million (8.4 p.c.) over the previous year.

Of the \$2.8 million payroll increase over June, approximately one-third was attributable to retroactive increases which in some instances, dated back to October 1965.

Cumulative payroll for January 1 to July 31, 1966 was \$481.2 million, up \$33.6 million (7.5 p.c.) from 1965. Payrolls for the first four months of the 1966-67 fiscal year amounted to \$284.3 million, \$20.6 million more than the same four months of 1965-66.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Employment in this group, at 223.8 thousand, was up 2.5 thousand (1.1 p.c.) from June and 11.9 thousand (5.6 p.c.) from July 1965. Almost half of the June-July 1966 increase was due to additional "casuals" engaged for the summer.

Gross payroll for the month amounted to \$97.6 million, 0.5 p.c. higher than in June, and 15.3 p.c. above July a year ago.

Cumulative payrolls for the period January 1 to July 31, totalled \$670.3 million, an increase of 16.9 p.c. compared to the same period of 1965. For the first four months of the fiscal year, payrolls smounted to \$389.8 million, up 17.2 p.c. from the June-July period, 1965-66.

A function analysis of employment between June and July shows most variations to be of a seasonal nature. The exception appears under "Water Resources" (Natural Resources and Primary Industries) where there has been a marked increase since June. This follows the transfer of the "Water Resources" Division from the Department of Northern Affairs and National Resources to the Department of Mines and Technical Surveys, where its Division title became "Research and Investigation on Water Resources". The function of this Division has broadened in scope thereby requiring substantially more staff.

#### Comments

An extensive reorganization of the government service was announced in December 1965 by the Prime Minister. This has been gradually implemented with the result that many units of organization have been moved from one department to another. Such movements, which reflect administrative reorganization are not reflected in Table 11 which is intended to present the results of "normal" accessions and leaving of staff.

A comparison of hiring and separation rates for the second quarter 1966, with those of the first quarter indicates a few noteworthy variations.

- (1) <u>Dominion Bureau of Statistics</u> hirings continued to increase due to the 1966 Quinquennial Census. The hiring of additional staff for the 1966 population census began during the fourth quarter of 1965, eased slightly in the first quarter of this year, and increased noticably through the second quarter. The Census was taken on June 1.
- (2) Fisheries hirings by the main Department and Fisheries Research Board increased as the new season commenced.
- (3) National Revenue Taxation hirings are high, additional Taxation officers were taken on, in preparation for the next "Tax" year.

#### Notes and Definitions

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication.

The table shows for the three month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by \*). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

The following definitions apply to this table:

- 1. "Hiring" means the appointment of a person to a salaried position (as defined in the April, 1965, publication). Movements within a department are not considered as hirings.
- 2. "Separation" means the termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transferring to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations.
- 3. "Department", for this table only, is altered to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.




