FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

SEPTEMBER 1966

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1966.

INTRODUCTION

Civilian staff of the Federal Public Service decreased by 4.4 thousand ~~and~~ (1.2 p.c.) from 376.4 thousand in August 1966 to 372.0 thousand in September, but increased 17.8 thousand (5.0 p.c.) from the September 1965 staff strength of 354.2 thousand.

The September 1966 total payroll of \$169.7 million was \$6.6 million (3.8 p.c.) less than the August total, and \$5.0 million (2.8 p.c.) below the September 1965 figure. For further comment regarding this variation see Part B, page 7.

For the period January 1 to September 30, 1966 the cumulative payroll amounted to \$1,498 million, up 11.1 p.c. from the \$1,349 million payroll of 1965. Aggregate payroll for the period April 1 to September 30, was \$1,020 million in 1966, an increase of \$95.8 million over the equivalent period of 1965.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

At the end of September staff strength totalled 146.1 thousand employees with payroll for the month amounting to \$69.2 million. Changes from August included a decrease of 3.1 thousand (2.1 p.c.) in staff and a payroll increase of \$0.9 million (1.4 p.c.). Variations from September 1965 were an increase of 3.0 thousand employees (2.1 p.c.) and \$2.0 million (2.9 p.c.) in payrolls.

Cumulative payroll for January 1 to September 30 was \$618.6 million, compared to \$583.0 million for the same nine months of 1965. Payroll for the period April to September of the 1966-67 fiscal year amounted to \$421.6 million, \$22.6 million above the 1965-66 period.

PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Employees of this group totalled 225.9 thousand at the end of September 1966, down slightly (less than 1 p.c.) from August. This month-to-month decrease is due to the release of a) students, in summer employment, and b) the completion of summer projects. Employment rose 14.8 thousand (7.0 p.c.) from September 1965.

Gross payroll for the month was \$100.6 million, a decrease of \$7.6 million (7.0 p.c.) from August, and \$6.9 million (6.4 p.c.) less than September 1965. The August payroll included \$10.9 million in retroactive and overtime payments, while the September 1965 payroll included retroactive pay amounting to \$19.5 million to postal employees, technicians, craftsmen, hospital staffs (ward aides, etc.).

Cumulative payrolls, January 1 to September 30, 1966 were \$879.0 million, an increase of \$113.0 million (14.7 p.c.) over the same nine months of 1965. The April to September payroll was \$598.4 million, \$73.2 million (13.9 p.c.) above that period of 1965.

Minor variations appear in the analysis of employment by function. The seasonal drop in casual employment mentioned in the first paragraph was the main cause of decreases in: "Transportation and Communications-"Highways, Roads and Bridges" and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries-Minerals and Mines".
