#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1967.

#### INTRODUCTION

Civilian employment within the Public Service totalled 369.4 thousand at the end of December 1967. This was 6.5 p.c. below September but 1.6 p.c. above December 1966. Total payrolls for the last three months of the year amounted to \$584.3 million, opposed to \$597.4 million for the period July-September and \$550.1 million for the last three months of 1966. This represented variations of - 2.2 p.c. and + 6.2 p.c. respectively.

Cumulative payrolls for 1967 amounted to \$2,305 million, compared to \$2,048 million for 1966. Payrolls for the first nine months of the 1967-68 fiscal year were \$1,758 million, 12.0 p.c. above the same period of 1966-67.

Data related to the departmental salaried employees are again estimates, based on a monthly trend established as of April 30, 1967.

#### PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

In this Group there were 138.7 thousand employees at the end of December 1967, compared to 159.1 thousand in September and 142.4 thousand in December 1966. Total payrolls for the period October-December amounted to \$247.0 million, 5.3 p.c. below the previous three months, but 3.7 p.c. above the last three months of 1966.

Cumulative payrolls for 1967 amounted to \$985.0 million, for 1966 they totalled \$856.8 million. For the period April to December 1967 payrolls were \$755.5 million, compared to \$659.9 million for the same nine months of 1966.

The employment decrease between September and December is usual. However the release of approximately two-thirds of the Expo 67 Staff, plus a large decrease of Canadian National Railways employees resulted in an above average variation for the period. A year-to-year (1966/1967) comparison of employment by province indicated an employee decrease in every province but an increase in Yukon and the Northwest Territories. In the same period, payrolls increased throughout the country, except in Quebec. Approximately half the crown corporations reported a greater number of employees than for December 1966, but these increases were offset by the steady decrease in personnel by the Canadian National Railways, as announced in the Press by that Corporation some months ago.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Staff strength in this Group decreased slightly (2.3 p.c.) to 230.7 thousand at the end of December 1967, from the September figure of 236.1 thousand. The largest decrease occurred among the Casual employees, where the work is generally of a seasonal nature. Total payrolls for the three month period amounted to \$337.2 million, a very slight increase (0.2 p.c.) over the July to September payroll. Comparative employment for December 1966 was 221.3 thousand employees and a quarterly payroll of \$311.8 million, indicating increases of 4.2 p.c. and 8.1 p.c., respectively.

Payrolls for the 1967 calendar year amounted to \$1,320 million, \$129 million (10.8 p.c.) greater than for 1966.

With the proclamation of the National Transportation Act in March 1967, the Canadian Transport Commission came into being and the Air Transport Board, Board of Transport Commissioners, and the Canadian Maritime Commission became Committees under the jurisdiction of the new Commission. The change, which appears for the first time in this issue of "Federal Government Employment" is readily seen in the Departmental detail under Transport. In the functional analysis the Canadian Transport Commission is included under:

"Transportation and Communications - Other". Prior to this issue, "Air Transport Board" was included under "Airways"; "Board of Transport Commissioners" under "Railways", which now disappears from the Table stubs; and the "Canadian Maritime Commission" was included under "Waterways".

As mentioned in the first paragraph, and apart from the above changes due to the formation of the Canadian Transport Commission, the variations noted in the functional analysis are seasonal, with the exception of the Post Office where there is an increase of salaried employees. A large portion of that increase is simply a transfer of employees from Semi-Staff offices to full operational status. It can be noted that, as the numbers under Post Office (Operations) increase, the numbers in the footnote regarding "persons paid from Postal Revenues" decreases. However, while the footnote reports only the postmasters and assistants, many of the Post Offices reaching full status required additional staff to handle the volume of work.


