#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

#### MARCH 1967

#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1966.

#### INTRODUCTION

Civilian staff of the Federal Public Service increased 1.1 p.c. to 369.6 thousand at the end of March 1967, from 365.8 thousand in February. During the same period payrolls went up 1.9 p.c. to \$183.9 million, from \$180.5 million. A comparison with February 1966 show increases of 6.0 p.c. from 348.9 thousand employees and 16.1 p.c. from a payroll of \$158.4 million.

Cumulative payrolls for the first three months of 1967 totalled \$546.6 million, compared to \$477.5 million for the same period of 1966. Payroll for the fiscal year, 1966-67, amounted to \$2,117 million, 13.4 p.c. above 1965-66 figures.

#### PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Employment in this group increased 2.1 thousand (1.4 p.c.) during March, 1967, to 144.3 thousand from 142.2 thousand at the end of February. Payrolls for the month were up \$3.8 million (5.2 p.c.) to \$78.4 million from \$74.6 million the previous month. Employee increases were reported for all provinces except Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island and Manitoba, whereas increased payrolls were reported for all provinces and territories and for Crown Corporations employees abroad. The increased monthly payrolls were due chiefly to the greater number of working days in March, as compared to February.

A year-to-year comparison indicates employment to be 5.9 p.c. higher than in March 1966, while payrolls are up 16.4 p.c.

Cumulative totals for the three month period January 1 to March 31, 1967 amounted to \$229.4 million, 16.5 p.c. higher than for the same period of 1966. Payrolls for the 1966-67 fiscal year totalled \$889.3 million, 11.6 p.c. above the 1965-66 fiscal year.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Employees in this group numbered 225.3 thousand at the end of March 1967, up slightly (0.8 p.c.) from February and 6.0 p.c. above the March 1966 staff of 212.6 thousand. While the total payroll was down 0.4 p.c. from February, to \$105.5 million, it was an increase of 15.9 p.c. over the previous March. Although increases in the number of employees and the amount of payrolls were indicated by most provinces, Prince Edward Island and the Yukon and Northwest Territories reported decreases in both fields.

Aggregate payroll for the period January 1 to March 31 was up 13.0 p.c. to \$317.1 million from \$280.6 million for the same three months of 1966. The fiscal year payroll for this group amounted to \$1,227 million, compared to \$1,069 million for 1965-66.

Only minor variations are noted in both the functional and departmental detail, and these are of a seasonal nature.


