## JULY - SEPTEMBER 1968

## INTRODUCTION

This publication provides information on Federal Government Employment for the three month period (third quarter) ending September 30, 1968. Employees, including those of agencies and corporations but excluding the Armed Forces, numbered 379.3 thousand at the end of September 1968. This represents an increase of 1.0 per cent over the number at the end of June 1968 and 4.0 per cent over the number as at September $30,1967$.

Gross payrolls of $\$ 607.8$ million, during the quarter, represented an increase of 1.8 per cent over those for the previous quarter. Comparison with gross payrolls of the third quarter of 1967 revealed an increase of 1.7 per cent.

Cumulative payrolls for the nine month period January to September 1968 , amounted $\$ 1,786$ million, which represents an increase of 3.8 per cent over the comparable period for 1967. Gross payrolls for the six month period April to September 1968, amounted to $\$ 1,205$ million an increase of 2.6 per cent over the comparable period of 1967.

## IURT A - AGENCY CORPORATIONS, PROPR IETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES AND CORPORATIONS

This report includes, for the first time in the Federal Govermment Employment series, datia for the Canadian Film Development Corporation, an Agency Corporation, the Canada Deposit Insurance कrporation and the Cape Breton Development Corporation, both Proprietary Corporations and, the Ganadn Co:ncil and National Arts Centre Corporation, Other Agencies and Corporations.

The number of employees within this category totalled 144.9 thousand at the end of September 1968 , an increase of 8.7 thousand or 6.4 per cent over the June 1968 total of 136.2 thousand and a detedst of 14.3 thousand or 9.0 per cent from the September 1967 total of 159.1 thousand.

Gross payrolls for the quarter under review amounted to $\$ 250.1$ million, an increase of $\$ 4.2$ million or 1.7 per cent over the April - June quarter. Compared to the July - September quarter of 1967 , gross payrolls decreased by $\$ 10.7$ million or 4.1 per cent.

Although employment generally increases during the third quarter, due to the hiring of extra shat ior the summer months, the inclusion of the 5.5 thousand employees of the above mentioned corporations was one of the factors this time.

The decrease in employment, third quarter 1968 compared to third quarter 1967, was due in part to the gradual phasing out of the Canadian Corporation for the 1967 World Exhibition. At the end of September 1967 this corporation reported 9.5 thousand employees with a quarterly payroll of $\$ 13.0$ million compared to 40 employees at the end of September 1968 , with a quarterly payroll of $\$ 112$ thousand. Also contributing to the decrease was a drop of 9.8 thousand in the number employed :y the Canadian National Railways with a corresponding decrease in quarterly payrolls of $\$ 14.7$ million. The usual third quarter higher level of employment and payrolls within other organizations in this category partially offset these decreases.

Cumulative payrolls for the first nine months of 1968 totalled $\$ 723.8$ million compared to 5739.9 million for the corresponding period of 1967. Payrolls for the first six months of the lo6e-f9 fiscal year amounted to $\$ 496.0$ million, compared to $\$ 508.5$ million for the corresponding period ? 1967-68.

## PART B - DEPARTAENTS AND DEPARTMENTAL CORPORATIONS

Employees, at the end of September 1968, totalled 234.4 thousand, which represented a decrease of 2.0 per cent from the total at the end of June 1968 and was slightly less than 1.0 per cent below the cotal at September 30, 1967. This decrease took place in the "Casual and Others" category and was due to the release of persons hired for seasonal employment during the summer months.

Gross payrolls, for the third quarter 1968 , amounted to $\$ 357.7$ million, an increase of 1.8 per cent over the second quarter 1968 and 6.3 per cent over the third quarter of 1967 . Increases were recorded for all classes of employees.

Cumulative payrolls for the first nine months of 1968 totalled $\$ 1,063 \mathrm{million}$, an increase of 8. 1 per cent over the comparable period of 1967. Payrolls for the first six months of the 1968-69 fiscal year amounted to $\$ 709.2$ million which represented an increase of 6.6 per cent over the comparable period of 1967-68.

The Municipal Development and Loan Board, formerly shown under "Finance" in Tables 8 and 9, cuased operations in July 1968.

Data for the third quarter summary of "Hirings and Separations of Salaried Employees" was not available for inclusion in this report.

In the April - June 1968 issue of this publication it was noted in the "Change in Administration Structure", page 7, that the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation has been redesignated as the Canadian Radio-Television Commission. This should have stated that it was the Board of Broadcast Governors that had been redesignated. Also, in Table 6 of that report, footnote 4 should have been against total salaried employees of the postal services, item 49, and footnote 6 should have been against total ciasuals and others, item 54 , as well as against total prevailing rate, item 54.
