## FBDERAL GOVERNMENT BMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

## Explanatory Notea

The present statistics are the result of monthly survey of Goverment of Canada em= ployment published since April, 1952. During its period of publication this monthly report has had three different titles. In the period April, 1952 to August, 1953, it was known as "Government of Canada Employment and Payrol1s". In the period September, 1953 to March, 1954 the report was known as "Federal Government Bmployment and Payrolls" and since April, 1954 the name of the publication has been "Federsl Government Bmployment". The monthly statistical series replaces one formerly issued mnually under several different titles the first of which was "Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". This report was issued amually for the fiscal years ended March 31, 1925 to 1931. Combined reports with the above title were issued for the fiscal years ended 1932 to 1934; 1935 and 1936; and 1937 to 1939. The title of the report was changed to "Summary Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". Reports under this title were lissued in a combined form for the fiscal years ended 1940, to 1942 and for each of the fiscal years ended 1943 to 1948. The title was again changed to "Sumary Statistic*, Pederal Civil Service Fmployment and Payrolls" for the year ended March 31, 1949. For the years ended March 31, 1950, 1951 and 1952 three reports were issued entitled Mederal Civil Service Faployment and Payrolls".

These statistics are presented in form which is intended to facilitate, among other uses, direct comparisons between (a) numbers employed as presented in this publication and (b) the mumber of positions established as shown in the Estimates of Canada:

Table 1 includes statistics relating to Departments and Departmental Corporations as listed in Schedulea A and B of the Financial Administration Act, and in addition, the Auditor General's Office, Legislation (including the Senate, House of Comons and Library of Parliament) and the Privy Council (including the Privy Council Office and the Prime Minister's Residence). Table 2 includes the Agency and Proprietary Corporations etc. set out in Schedules C and D of the Financial Administration Act, and as listed in atater part of this text. Tables 3 and 4 (sumarized in Table 1) are based on an adinistrative classification which may be directly compared in most cases, with the Estimates of Canada for 1956-57. In these tables the totals which are shown exclude "casuals and other $\mathrm{m}^{n}$.

The statistics relate only to civilian employees and members of the Royal Cansidan Mounted Police Force (which being semi-military organization are not considered as being civilians). Members of the Armed Services are excluded. Deputy Ministers are included in the staffs of Departmental Services but Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor-General are excluded. For Boards, Comissions and other Agencies those members or officers serving on full-time basis, and whose salaries are fixed actordingly, are included, whereas directors or board members, who are paid on a per diem basis, or who receive a nominal honourarium for their services, are excluded.

A description of the sources of data and the bases upon which the information is mbaitted and prepared for use in these statistics is contained in the following outline:

## DEPARLARETS AKD DEPARTMEATAL CORPORATIONS (Tables 1, 3 and 4)

## CLASSIFIED POSITIOAS

The Doainion Bureau of Statistics maintains individual position records on an establishment basis for what are called "classified positions" in the various departaents and branches of goverment, the employees of which come within the general purview of Treasury Board Regulation and Control. A tabulation from these records provides a count of the number of employeen and their selary rite. Becuse of an inevitable timelag in the routing of position and personnel changen through
nomal Civil Service channels and the posting of these changes on Bureau of Statistics records, it is not always possible to include all of the changes for the previous month. The count of esployees for any given month, therefore, will not necessarily represent exactly the number of staff actually on strength at the end of the month. The earnings given for employees in the classified positions, being based on annual salary rates, will not necessarily equal the actual amounts paid in salaries in any given month. These factors, however, are not considered to be of such significance as to sericusly affeet the usefulnass of the statistics.

Permanent, temporary and term employens are all included th the classitted catagory and no attempt is made to prepare separate statistics on each. In addition to the records maintained for classified positions individual position records are also maintained for the following boards, commissions and agencies:

## EXRAMT CLASSES

Prevailing Rates, Ships' Officers and Ships' Grews, and Casuals and Others are not maintained on individual position records as is the case in connection with classified positions. The Bureau of Statistics obtains data on these staffs by means of special reports taken from payroll records. Since these reports are prepared on the basis of pay periods they may be said to represent the actual amounts paid out to employees during each month.

## COMPARABILITY HITH PORMER SURVEY

The old tatistical series on an anusl basis for the years 1925 to 1952 was iatended to include only the number of permanent and temporary employees in the general administrative departments of goverament (this generally speaking included those coming under the Civil Service Act). The survey did not include count of what were described as "non-enumerated" classes. Since there was a distinct difference in the interpretation by various departments of what constituted "non-emumerated" classes there wa difference in the coverage of employees included in the annual series. Since the monthly series includes groups of employees not formerly included as well as varlous government services not formerly covered the statistics should not be compared with the former annual series.

## DRSCRIPTIONS OF PRISCIPAL TERMS USED

1. Department: Also known as departmental services, departments are the named divisions of the Government of Canada as defined in the Financial Administration Act.
2. Crom Corporations: a Crown Corporation is corporation wich is ultimately accountable, through a Minister, to Parliament for the conduct of its affairs, and includes the corporations named as departmentel corporations, agency corporatione and proprietary corporatione in the Financial Adainistration Act.
3. Depertwental Corporation: Crown Corporation which is a servant or agent of Mer Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for administrative, eupervisory, or regulatory servicas of a governmental mature.
4. Agency Corporation: Crow Corporation which is an agent of lier Majesty in right of Camada and is responsible for the managenent of trading or service operations on a quad-comercial besis, or for the management of procurement, construction or disposal activities on behalf of Her Majesty in right of Canada.
5. Proprietary Corporation: a Crown Corporation which (1) is responsible for the management of lending or financial operetions, or for the management of comercial and industrisl operations involving the production of or desling in goods and the supplying of services to the public, and (2) is ordinarily required to conduct its operations without appropriations from the Pederal Treasury.
