

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1957. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases, however, departmental reports give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month. Since the published figure in the report normally represents the number of staff on strength on the last day of the month, data shown will not agree in some cases with figures released by departments since the latter are usually based on a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period in the month.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETORY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In Tables 2 to 6 inclusive employment data for the Department of Public Works was not available for certain services. These are:

Public Building Construction and Services - Toronto (Prevailing Rate)

Harbours and Rivers Engineering Services - Quebec (Ships' Officers and Crews and Casuals)

- Toronto (Casuals)

A study of the most recent statistics available for these branches indicates that approximately 25 persons employed as ships' officers and crews with some \$7,000 earnings, 200 prevailing rate employees with \$20,000 earnings and an unknown amount of casual employment would be involved. Steps have been taken to include reports for these offices as soon as possible.

October, 1957

Salaried employees in the Senate and House of Commons increased owing to the commencement of the new session of Parliament. The Department of National Defence also had increased salaried staff. The decrease in the number of prevailing rate employees occurred as a result of seasonal terminations of staff principally by Fisheries and Northern Affairs and National Resources. This report includes, for the first time, data on ships' officers and crews and casual employees of the Department of Public Works, Harbours and Rivers Engineering Services at St. John's, Newfoundland. The inclusion of this Branch is the main reason for the increases in the numbers of ships' officers and crews and casual employees.


