

#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

November, 1957

#### INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1957. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases, however, departmental reports give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month. Since the published figure in the report normally represents the number of staff on strength on the last day of the month, data shown will not agree in some cases with figures released by departments since the latter are usually based on a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period in the month.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETORY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In Tables 2 to 6 inclusive employment data for the Department of Public Works was not available for certain services. These are:

Public Building Construction and Services - Toronto (Prevailing Rate)
Harbours and Rivers Engineering Services - Toronto (Casuals)

A study of the most recent statistics available indicates that approximately 160 prevailing rate employees with \$25,000 earnings and an unknown amount of casual employment would be involved. Steps have been taken to include reports for these offices as soon as possible.

#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

November, 1957

During November a number of Departments reported seasonal decreases in casual employment. The National Parks Branch of Northern Affairs and National Resources and the Unemployment Insurance Commission had increases in prevailing rate staff in the first case and casual help in the second.


