

#### PART A

Table 1 - A oncy and Proprietary Corporations and Other Quasi-Independent Government Bodies

Employment reported below represents the aggregate of numbers employed and salaries and wages paid for, the months indicated, by agency and proprietary corporations and other quasi-independent government bodies. A list of these is shown on page 23 of this report. The data presented in table 1 are in addition to the administrative services of government which are presented in Part B of this report. The International Pacific Salmon Fisheries Commission and the International Pacific Halibut Commission have been deleted since they, as the employing agencies, acted as international bodies. The Northern Ontario Pipe Line Crown Corporation has been included for the first time beginning with this report.

#### DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

An explanation of how the statistics of this group of government organizations are collected and maintained is given on pages 24 and 25 of this report. The tabular presentation of the detail summarized in table 2 is made in two principal forms, these being according to a classification by function and an administrative classification. The classification by function is explained below. The administrative classification is based upon the departmental

establishment as presented in the official Estimates thus permitting the analyst to follow the growth and changes in employment of each department. This process, of course, must always take into consideration changes in departmental organization which occur from time to time.

#### CLASSIFICATION BY FUNCTION

The statistics of departmental branches, services and corporations are classified in tables 3 and 4 by function. This is the first month in which this presentation of federal government employment statistics has been made. The purpose of providing a classification by function is to supply a means of studying the operations of governments without the complication which results from differences in administrative establishment which occur from time to time in each government and between governments. This analysis is useful in three ways. First it permits a detailed study of employment by the Government of Canada according to the main purposes or functions. Since these functions are not subject to periodic changes which alter the administrative structure of the government it is possible to develop a statistical series which, with minor exceptions, is consistent over an extended period of time. Second, since differences in administrative establishment are eliminated it is possible to make meaningful comparisons between federal government expenditures on employment and similar expenditures by other levels of government. Third, an analysis of the relationship between expenditures on employment and total expenditures can be made with regard to each function. The use of percentages will facilitate comparisons especially between levels of government.

The classification by function reflects the purpose served by the expenditure, and employment statistics presented on this basis have been classified in accordance with concepts evolved by the Public Finance Section of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the presentation of financial statistics. The following listing shows how the administrative detail has been applied to the various functions and will serve to indicate clearly the meaning of each function.

#### Notes

In the three cases listed below employees perform services which apply to more than one function. Since it is not possible to make a split by activities the staff and earnings have been assigned to the function which represented the greatest portion of employment. The other functions performed are indicated below:

- (1) The Veterans' Business and Professional Loans Act also applicable to function "Veterans' Pensions and Other Benefits"
- (2) Northwest Territories and Other Field Services of Northern Administration and Lands Branch also applicable to function "Social Welfare" and function "Education"
- (3) Immigration Medical Services also applicable to function "Health"

#### CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS REPORTS

Commencing with April, 1957, a change in the method of collection of data for this report was implemented and the accompanying review of the series showed that in a number of cases, gaps existed. Steps were taken to obtain information covering staffs which had not previously been reported. Reports of the type indicated were submitted for the first time in April and covered 422 employees who had earnings of \$82,442 during that month.

The review of statistics reported also led to a change in the treatment of employees "locally-engaged abroad". These are persons employed by the Canadian Government at posts outside Canada who are not in receipt of allowances pursuant to the Heads of Post Regulations, the Foreign Service Officers Regulations or the Foreign Service Employees Regulations and also are not contributors under Part I of the Public Service Superamnuation Act. These were formerly included in the column "casuals and others" but have now been distributed according to type of employment, hence most are included in the "salaried" column, some in the "prevailing rate" column and the remainder in the "casuals and others" column. As a consequence, the statistics are somewhat different from those presented in the March, 1957 and previous reports.

Adoption of the new reporting forms and the resulting study led to a different treatment of employment in the following services:

- 1. Finance Royal Commission on Canada's Economic Prospects: the majority of employees were formerly treated as "casuals and others", all employees are now treated as "salaried".
- Mational Film Board: "casuals and others" employees will far exceed those previously reported with the inclusion of contract employment beginning with this report.
- 3. Legislation: Sessional employees formerly listed as "basuals and others" are now treated as "salaried" employees.

The Royal Commission on Broadcasting which went out of existence on March 31, 1957 has been deleted from this report.

The use of the term "salaried" in the present report is intended to end confusion which has resulted from the former use of the term "classified". The term "classified" is understood by many persons using these statistics to relate only to employees who are certified under the Civil Service Act, whereas the coverage as presented in this report includes many salaried employees whose positions are exempt from the Civil Service Act. "Salaried" as used in this report means all persons paid on the basis of a stated annual salary rate, with the exception of the group of government employees which are known as "ships' officers". The latter group are excluded because of their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act. Further explanation in this regard is presented on pages 24 and 25 of this report.

#### COMPARABILITY BETWEEN NUMBERS AND SARNINGS

The user of these statistics is advised to avoid making direct comparisons between the numbers of persons reported and the earnings reported, the reason for this being that numbers relate to the last day of the month wherever possible and otherwise to the final pay period of the month. Since in certain categories, especially casual employment, a very considerable fluctuation in numbers employed may occur during any month, it may be seen that a comparison between the earnings of all persons employed during the month and the numbers on strength at the end of the month would in many cases not be valid.

Further detail on methods of collection and other background information may be obtained by reference to the "Explanatory Notes" which appear on pages 23 to 26 of this report.

#### PART C

#### Explanatory Notes

The present statistics are the result of a monthly survey of Government of Canada employment published since April, 1952. During its period of publication this monthly report has had three different titles. In the period April, 1952 to August, 1953 it was known as "Government of Canada Employment and Payrolls". In the period September, 1953 to March, 1954 the report was known as "Federal Government Employment and Payrolls" and since April, 1954 the name of the publication has been "Federal Government Employment". The monthly statistical series replaces one formerly issued annually under several different titles the first of which was "Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". This report was issued annually for the fiscal years ended March 31, 1925 to 1931.

Combined reports with the above title were issued for the fiscal years ended 1932 to 1934; 1935 and 1936; and 1937 to 1939. The title of the report was changed to "Summary Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". Reports under this title were issued in a combined form for the fiscal years ended 1940 to 1942 and for each of the fiscal years ended 1943 to 1948. The title was again changed to "Summary Statistics, Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls" for the year ended March 31, 1949. For the years ended March 31, 1950, 1951 and 1952 three reports were issued entitled "Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls".

These statistics are presented in a form which is intended to facilitate, among other uses, direct comparisons between (a) numbers employed as presented in this publication and (b) the number of positions established for each administrative branch of government.

The report is split into two main portions. Part A is composed of one table which presents the statistics of agency and proprietary corporations, and those of other quasi-independent government bodies. These are listed in a later part of this text. Part B consists of tables 2 to 7 which present statistics relating to departmental branches, services and corporations as listed in Schedules A and B of the Financial Administration Act plus the Auditor General's Office, Legislation (including the Senate, House of Commons and Library of Parliament) and the Privy Council (including the Privy Council Office and the Prime Minister's Residence). The information regarding departmental branches, services and corporations is summarized in table 2. Detail regarding these bodies is presented on the basis of a classification by function in tables 3 and 4 and administratively in tables 5 and 6 while table 7 gives details of overtime earnings by department. In all the tables in Part B totals shown exclude "casuals and others" which are presented separately.

The statistics relate only to civilian employees and members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Force (which being a semi-military organization are not considered as being civilians). Members of the Armed Services are excluded. Deputy Ministers are included in the staffs of Departmental Services but Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor-General are excluded. For Boards, Commissions and other Agencies those members or officers serving on a full-time basis, and whose salaries are fixed accordingly, are included, whereas directors or board members, who are paid on a per diem basis, or who receive a nominal honourarium for their services are excluded.

A description of the sources of data and the bases upon which the information is submitted and prepared for use in these statistics is contained in the following outline:

#### PART A

### AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES (TABLE I)

Statistics for this group of government bodies do not provide for any segregation between salaried and non-salaried employees and as a consequence the totals reported include all persons on strength during the final pay period of each month, including casual employees. Agency corporations included above are indicated with a (C) and Proprietary Corporations with a (D). These are as listed in schedules "C" and "D" of the Financial Administration Act. The remainder are the quasi-independent government bodies which, though not subject to the Financial Administration Act are considered as being Canadian Government organizations and their employees as employed by the Federal Government.

#### PART B

### DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS (TABLES 2 TO 7 INCL.)

#### Salaried Employees (Formerly Entitled "Classified Employees")

The statistics shown in Tables 2 to 6 under the heading "Salaried" include all persons paid on the basis of an annual salary rate except "Ships' Officers" which, while paid an annual salary rate are subject to special treatment under the regulations made pertaining to the Financial Administration Act. These salaried employees are in departmental branches, services and corporations which are subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board and for which the positions are outlined in detail in the Estimates of Canada, or are established by means of supplementary Treasury Board Minutes.

Individual position records are maintained for the majority of salaried positions in the departmental branches and services of the Government of Canada. Because of an inevitable time lag in the routing of position and personnel changes through normal channels it is not always possible to include all of the changes in statistics for the month to which they apply. The count of employees for any given month, therefore, will not necessarily represent the number of staff on strength at the end of the month. Employee earnings, being based on annual salary rates, will not necessarily equal the actual amounts paid in salaries in any given month. These factors are not considered to be of such significance as to seriously affect the usefulness of the statistics. Permanent, temporary and term employees are all included in the salaried category and not attempt is made to prepare separate statistics on each.

In addition to the records maintained for the regular governmental services and departments, individual position records are also maintained for the following Boards, Commissions and Agencies:

Individual position records are not maintained in the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the following, and statistical data are submitted on reporting forms. Earnings for this group represent the total regular earnings paid to all persons employed during each month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not:

All salaried persons who are "locally-engaged" abroad are reported on forms at the present time and position record cards are not maintained for each individual position.

Non-Salaried Employees (Prevailing Rates, Ships' Officers, Ships' Crews, Casuals and "Others")

Individual position records for these staffs are not maintained as is the case in connection with the majority of "salaried" positions. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics obtains data on the "non-salaried" staff by means of special reports based on payroll and other records. Since these reports are prepared on the basis of pay period they represent the actual amounts paid out to employees during each month. The ships' officers are included in the group of non-salaried positions even though they are in fact salaried employees. This latter group has been recorded separately from the salaried employee group owing to their special treatment under the provisions of the Financial Administration Act.


#### COMPARABILITY WITH FORMER SURVEY

The statistical series produced on an annual basis for the years 1925 to 1952 was intended to include only the number of permanent and temporary employees in the general administrative departments of government (this generally speaking included those coming under the Civil Service Act). The survey did not include a count of what were described as "non-enumerated" classes. Since there was a distinct variation in the interpretation by departments of what constituted "non-enumerated" classes there resulted differences between departments in the coverage of employees included in the annual series. The monthly series which commenced in April, 1952 includes groups of employees not formerly included as well as various government services not formerly covered and consequently the statistics should not be compared with the former annual series.

#### DESCRIPTIONS OF PRINCIPAL TERMS USED

1. Department: Also known as departmental services, departments are the named divisions of the Government of Canada as defined in the Financial Administration Act.

- 2. Crown Corporations: a Crown Corporation is a corporation which is ultimately accountable, through a Minister, to Parliament for the conduct of its affairs, and includes the corporations named as departmental corporations, agency corporations and proprietary corporations in the Financial Administration Act.
- 3. Departmental Corporation: a Crown Corporation which is a servant or agent of Ner Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for administrative, supervisory, or regulatory services of a governmental nature.
- 4. Agency Corporation: a Crown Corporation which is an agent of Her Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for the management of trading or service operations on a quasi-commercial basis, or for the management of procurement, construction or disposal activities on behalf of Her Majesty in right of Canada.
- 5. Proprietary Corporation: a Crown Corporation which (1) is responsible for the management of lending or financial operations, or for the management of commercial and industrial operations involving the production of or dealing in goods and the supplying of services to the public, and (2) is ordinarily required to conduct its operations without appropriations from the Federal Treasury.
