

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1957. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases, however, departmental reports give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month. Since the published figure in the report normally represents the number of staff on strength on the last day of the month, data shown will not agree in some cases with figures released by departments since the latter are usually based on a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period in the month.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETORY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown. The increase between May and June is the result of the hiring of additional staff by the Canadian National Railways during June.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In Tables 2 to 6 inclusive employment data for the Department of Public Works was not available for certain services. These are:

A study of the most recent statistics available for these branches indicates that approximately 80 persons employed as ships' officers and crews with some \$16,000 earnings, 200 prevailing rate employees with \$20,000 earnings and an unknown amount of casual employment would be involved. Steps have been taken to include reports for these offices as soom as possible.

June, 1957

Employment changes between May and June, 1957 are principally the result of seasonal increases and decreases in the staffs of various departments. The considerable drop in the Taxation Division of the Department of National Revenue was due to the annual lay-off of staff following the completion of income tax returns.


