

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1957. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases, however, departmental reports give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month. Since the published figure in the report normally represents the number of staff on strength on the last day of the month, data shown will not agree in some cases with figures released by departments since the latter are usually based on a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period in the month.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETORY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown. Canadian National Railways reported a reduction in staff for the fifth successive month. During the period the total staff of the railway was decreased by almost 20,000 employees.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In Tables 2 to 6 inclusive employment data for the Department of Public Works was not available for certain services. These are:

Public Building Construction and Services - Toronto (Prevailing Rate)
Harbours and Rivers Engineering Services - Toronto (Casuals)

A study of the most recent statistics available for these branches indicates that approximately 160 prevailing rate employees with \$25,000 earnings and an unknown amount of casual employment would be involved. Data on these Services will be included commencing with April, 1958.

January, 1958

A number of departments recorded small increases in "casuals and others" employment. The National Parks branch of Northern Affairs and National Resources and the Canal Services branch of Transport carried on special work programs during the month. Earnings of Christmas helpers in the Post Office department are recorded as footnotes in this report. Casual employees of the Regional Offices of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics are included for the first time in this report. Also reported for the first time are staffs of the Royal Commission on Price Spreads in Food Products and the Royal Commission on Energy Policies which have been included in statistics for the Privy Council.


