

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1958. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number of strength on the final day of the month. In some cases published reports of departments and corporations give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month and hence they may not agree with data shown in this publication.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown. The decline in staff was due to seasonal layoffs.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Changes in employment during November were few with Salaried employment virtually unchanged. A rise in Prevailing Rate employment which occurred in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, etc.", was offset by a seasonal decline in "Natural Resources and Primary Industries, Fish and Game, and Forests". Seasonal decreases in Casual employment occurred in "Defence Services", "Transportation and Communications - Waterways", and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands" as well as in a number of other functions. Coincident with the annual seasonal decline in employment in many industries the function "Social Welfare - National Employment Service" had a substantial increase in Casual employment. This results from hirings of staff by the Unemployment Insurance Commission to help process the greatly increased number of applications for unemployment insurance benefits and for employment which occurs in the fall of each year.


