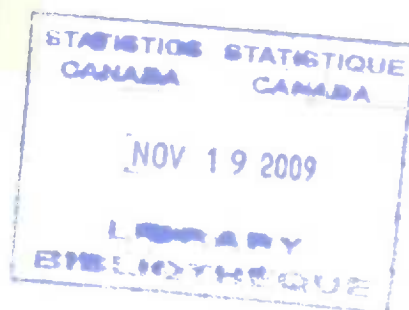

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

December, 1958

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1958. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases published reports of departments and corporations give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month and hence they may not agree with data shown in this publication.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER GOVERNMENT BODIES

Earnings were higher despite a decline in numbers employed. This resulted from a retroactive pay increase paid in December to non-operating employees of the Canadian National Railways.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Employment of salaried, prevailing rate and ships' staffs changed only slightly in December as compared with November. Casual staff in "Social Welfare - National Employment Service" was up 1,236 or 51 p.c. due to seasonal demands on the Unemployment Insurance Commission.

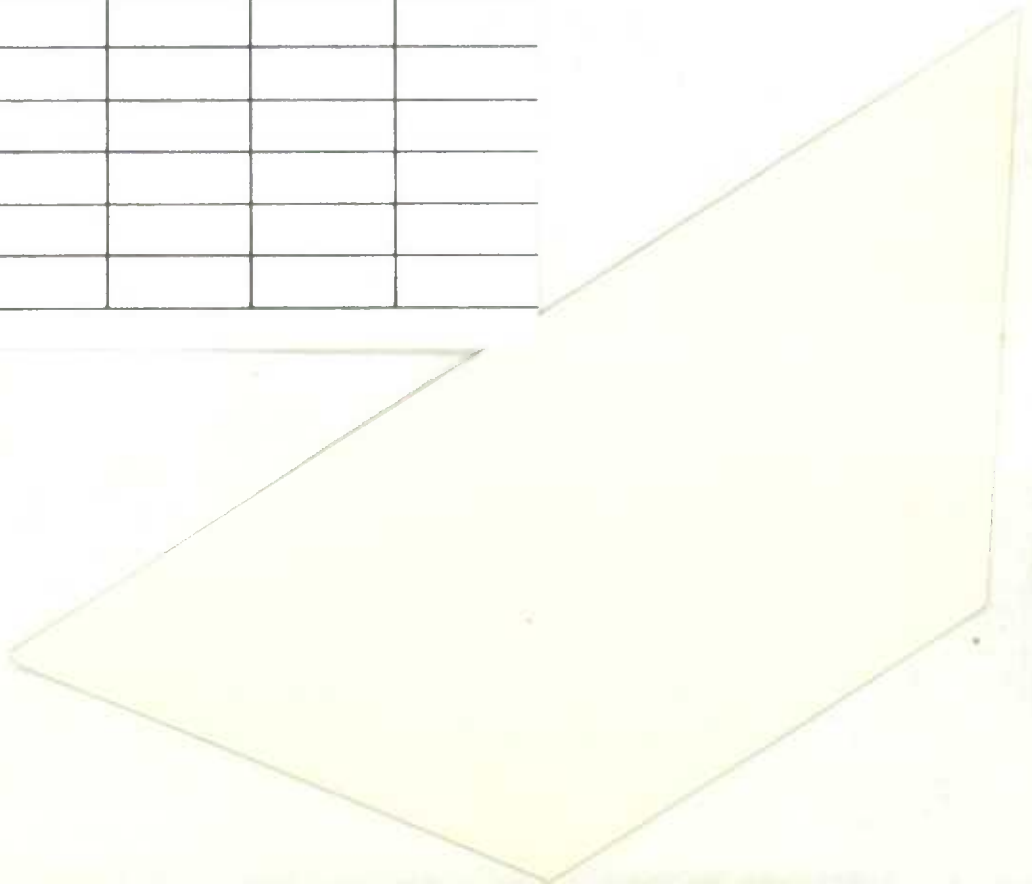
