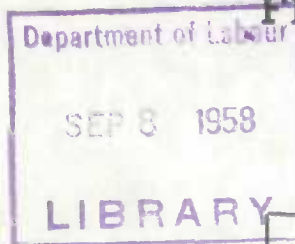

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1957. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases, however, departmental reports give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month. Since the published figure in the report normally represents the number of staff on strength on the last day of the month, data shown will not agree in some cases with figures released by departments since the latter are usually based on a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period in the month.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Small increases in salaried staff were reported by most departments but the House of Commons and the Senate had reduced staffs owing to the dissolution of the 23rd Parliament. The overtime reported in Table 7 for the Post Office includes overtime paid during the annual Christmas rush to regular employees of the department.
