

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1958. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases published reports of departments and corporations give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month and hence they may not agree with data shown in this publication.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown. Numbers employed, while continuing to rise, were still well below June 1957 figures due mainly to reduced rail activity by the Canadian National Railways.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Completions of annual income tax returns led to a large decrease in the salaried staff of the Taxation Division of National Revenue. This was offset by seasonal increases reported by several departments. Prevailing rate employment was seasonally higher in the departments of Agriculture, Fisheries, National Defence and Northern Affairs and National Resources. Casual employment was reduced in the Unemployment Insurance Commission and the department of Finance while increases were recorded by Citizenship and Immigration, National Defence, Northern Affairs and National Resources, Public Works and Transport.


