

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1958. Wherever possible the numbers of persons employed, as published in this report, are based on a count of the number on strength on the final day of the month. In some cases published reports of departments and corporations give a count of the number of persons paid during the final pay period or on strength on the final pay day in the month and hence they may not agree with data shown in this publication.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER QUASI-INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT BODIES

Table 1 summarizes the record of employment of these organizations for the months shown.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

A comparison of July, 1958 data with those for June shows that Salaried employees were down by 412 in the Executive and Administrative services of the General Government function and by 1,066 in Indian and Eskimo schools under the function Education. An increase of 204 was recorded in Natural Resources and Primary Industries. Prevailing Rate staffs increased seasonally in Defence Services and in Natural Resources and Primary Industries. Substantial increases in Casual staff occurred in: Defence Services; Transportation and Communications - Airways and Waterways; National Resources and Primary Industries - Lands: Settlement and Agriculture. Casual employment was lower in: Social Welfare - National Employment Services; Education - Indian and Eskimo Schools.

The large reductions in staff of the Department of Citizenship and Immigration resulted from the annual summer layoff of teaching and maintenance staffs of the Indian and Eskimo schools. The Taxation Branch of National Revenue had a further seasonal decrease in staff following the completion of the annual collection of income tax returns.


