

# INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1959. This report includes, for the first time, an analysis of the number of male and female employees in departmental branches, services and corporations. This information is included in table 5 and indicates that more than 7 of every 10 employees in the Federal public service are men.

In October 1959, total employees of the Federal Government declined for the third consecutive month following a seasonal pattern similar to last year where peak employment was reached in July 1958. There were 5,429 less employees in October 1959 as compared with September 1959, but 2,535 more than in October 1958. Earnings of these employees decreased by \$442,000 from September but were \$5,541,000 above October 1958. Employees in Departments decreased by 2,318 and in Proprietory Corporations by 3,278 from September 1959, while in Departmental Corporations they increased by 276. Earnings of Departmental employees decreased by \$60,000, those of Proprietory Corporations declined by \$461,000 while earnings of Departmental Corporation staff increased by \$40,000. Total earnings for January 1 to October 31, 1959 were \$52,633,000 higher than the corresponding period of 1958.

# PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations in October, 1959 was 3,387 lower than in September, 1959. The decline was due mainly to seasonal decreases by the Canadian National Railways and the Northern Transportation Company Ltd. Earnings of employees decreased by \$422,000 in October, 1959 as compared with September, 1959. The ten month total was a little over half a billion dollars (\$500,510,000) a rise of 6.7 p.c. compared with \$469,005,000 for the equivalent period of 1958.

### PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Salaried employees rose in the functions "Education - Indian and Eskimo Schools and Schools in N.W.T." and "Other - Post Office" due to employment of Teachers by the departments of Citizenship and Immigration and Northern Affairs and National Resources and the employment of more staff by the Post Office. There were less salaried employees in the functions "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Forests" due to seasonal decreases by the department of Northern Affairs and National Resources. Prevailing rate employees declined in the functions "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game and (b) Lands: Settlement and Agriculture". Ships officers and crew employees were lower in the function "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Fish and Game". There were less casual employees in the functions "Defence Services", General Government - Executive and Administrative", "Transportation and Communications - (a) Airways and (b) Waterways" and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game, (b) Lands: Settlement and Agriculture and (c) Other" but more in the functions "Social Welfare - National Employment Services" and "Education - Indian and Eskimo Schools and Schools in N.W.T." The departments of Agriculture, Citizenship and Immigration, Fisheries, Labour, National Defence, Northern Affairs and National Resources, Public Works and Transport were mainly responsible for the majority of changes recorded in prevailing rate, ships' officers and crew and casual employees.


