INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1959. This report includes, for the first time, staff employed outside of Canada by Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies. As a result the year to year comparison of numbers and earnings is not possible on the basis of totals for November, 1959. Not including the 9,020 employees abroad who had earnings of \$4,114,000 total employment in the Federal Government was 335,253 in November 1959 and their earnings amounted to \$109,755,000. These compare with 330,470 persons employed in November 1958 whose earnings totalled \$104,358,000. Staff of Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations employed abroad have been included in these statistics since their commencement in April, 1952. In November they numbered 2,427 persons with regular earnings (excluding overtime and special payments) of \$678,632.

Eleven month totals show that earnings of all Federal employees were \$1,225,407,000 to November 30, 1959 and \$1,163,264,000 to November 30, 1958. Removing the influence of the \$4,114,-000 paid to the foreign located staff mentioned above, the year-to-year increase was \$58,029,000 or 5.0 p.c.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Staff employed outside of Canada by Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies have been included in Federal Government Employment statistics for the first time with the release of this report. At the end of November there were 9,020 persons in the employ of these government bodies in foreign countries. The great majority were working for subsidiaries and branches of the Canadian National Railways in the United States. Trans-Canada Airlines was the only other government corporation having a substantial number of employees outside Canada.

The inclusion of the staff located outside Canada led to an increase rather than the expected decrease in employees and earnings of these government Corporations. Not including staff abroad the total number of employees declined to 138,535 from 141,491 in October, while staff payroll in November 1959 on the same basis amounted to \$49,300,000 compared with \$52,055,000 in October.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Salaried employment increased by almost 350 over October and by 2,415 over November 1958. The main changes in the 12 month interval were a decrease of 1,200 employees in Defence Services, an increase of 1,400 in General Government and a rise of 800 in Post Office. Prevailing Rate staff was down 735 from October and 1,282 from November 1958 with the principal change being a drop of 600 in Defence Services in the period of one year. Only small changes occurred in Ships' Officers and Crews and in Casual employment.

An analysis of the male-female ratio of staffs shows that slightly over 72 p.c. of Salaried staff in November were men. The ratio varies considerably by function with women accounting for less than 15 p.c. of Transportation and Communications staff but for almost half the employees in Health and Social Welfare and about 65 p.c. of those in Education.


