

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April 1959. The December 1959 report includes for the first time an analysis of hiring and separation rates of salaried employees in departmental branches, services and corporations which have separately administered personnel offices. This information is included in table 9 and will be published regularly in the last month of each quarter.

There was a seasonal decline of employees from 344,273 in November to 337,981 in December, 1959. Employee earnings, however, rose slightly from \$114,049,000 to \$114,401,000. A comparison with December 1958 figures shows that Federal Government employment (excluding staff of Agency and Proprietary corporations abroad) was down very slightly at 329,017 in December 1959 versus 329,737 while employee earnings were up 3.1 p.c. at \$109,807,000 against \$106,530,000.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations in December was 4,355 less than in November. The decline occurred in every province and was due mainly to seasonal decreases by the Canadian National Railways and the National Harbours Board. Earnings of these employees increased by \$43,000 because there were two more working days in December than November.

In using cumulative totals or comparing employees and earnings with those for the previous year, the staff located abroad (outside Canada) should be deducted for the months of November and December 1959 in order to have comparable figures. This is due to the fact that data pertaining to those employees were not included prior to November 1959. At the end of December 1959, 8,964 employees of Agency and Proprietary Corporations were located outside Canada. These staff had earnings of \$4,594,000 during December 1959 and \$8,888,000 during November and December 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Salaried employees declined in the functions "Natural Resources and Primary Industries (a) Minerals and Mines and (b) Other" due to seasonal decreases by the department of Mines and Technical Surveys. There were less prevailing rate employees in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, etc." due to seasonal decreases by the department of Northern Affairs and National Resources. Ships' Officers and Crew employees were lower in the functions "Transportation and Communication - Waterways" and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Fish and Game" due to decreases by the departments of Fisheries and Public Works. The main changes recorded for casual employees were a) decreases in the functions "Defence Services", "Transportation and Communications - Waterways", "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands, etc.", and "Other - Post Office" and b) a rise in "Social Welfare - National Employment Services". The departments of Agriculture, Labour, National Defence, Post Office, Public Works and Transport were responsible for the above changes in casual employment which were principally seasonal in nature.

Total employees of Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations declined by 1,937 in December 1959 as compared with November 1959. Women employed numbered 702 more but male staff decreased by 1,307 and those for whom sex detail is unavailable were down by 1,332.

During the fourth quarter of 1959 the rate of hirings among salaried employees was 12 per thousand and the rate of separations 13 per thousand indicating a decrease in staff. The hirings and separations rates for women were greater than those of men denoting a larger turnover of female staff. The separation rates were above those of hirings for men due mainly to seasonal staff reductions by the departments of Fisheries, Mines and Technical Surveys and Northern Affairs and National Resources.
