#### INTRODUCTION

Employment in departments rose by 4,638, in agency corporations by 352 and in proprietory corporations by 4,541 while that in departmental corporations was down by 440 and in "other" agencies by 8 employees. Earnings of departmental employees were \$927,000 higher in total, those of agency corporation staff rose \$246,000, of proprietary corporation employees gained \$2,139,000 and of "other" agencies personnel were up \$4,000. A \$12,000 decline occurred in the earnings of persons employed by departmental corporations.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Increased employment by the Canadian National Railways, Atomic Energy Limited, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, National Harbours Board and Northern Transportation Limited accounted for the higher total. Approximately 1,800 Polymer workers lost some \$680,000 as a result of the continuance of their strike which had commenced on March 19th.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Salaried employment was substantially higher in the functions "Defence Services", "General Government" and "National Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game and (b) Forests". Prevailing rate employees were more numerous in "Defence Services", "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." and "National Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game (b) Forests and (c) Other". There were more Casual employees in "Defence Services", "Transportation and Communications" and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries" but fewer in "Social Welfare - National Employment Services" and "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc.". The majority of changes were seasonal in nature such as the employment of summer staff by the departments of Agriculture, National Defence and Northern Affairs and National Resources and the layoff of peak period staff by the Unemployment Insurance Commission.


