INTRODUCTION

The staff strength rose by 7,132 and the payroll by \$2,941,000 from May to June 1959. Employees in Departments rose by 3,530, in Agency Corporations by 148, in Proprietary Corporations by 4,319 and in Other Agencies by 24. On the other hand, employees in Departmental Corporations were reduced by 889. Earnings of employees in Departments increased by \$982,000 in Agency Corporations by \$34,000, in Proprietary Corporations by \$2,039,000 and in Other Agencies by \$13,000. Earnings of Departmental Corporation employees decreased by \$127,000. Total payroll for the first six months of 1959 was \$652 million of which \$363 million was earned by employees of the Departments and Departmental Corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Seasonal increases were reported by a number of Corporations led by the Canadian National Railways. The Polymer Corporation strike ended on June 24th when more than 500 wage-earners returned to work.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Employment of Salaried and Ships' Officers and Crews increased only slightly in June over May 1959. Prevailing Rate employment was higher in the functions "Defence Services", "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands: Settlement and Agriculture" due to seasonal increases by the departments of National Defence, Northern Affairs and National Resources and Agriculture. Increased Casual employment in functions "Defence Services" and "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" was offset by a substantial drop in "Social Welfare - National Employment Services". This was the result of seasonal increases by the departments of National Defence and Public Works and a sharp decline in numbers of casual staff of the Unemployment Insurance Commission.


