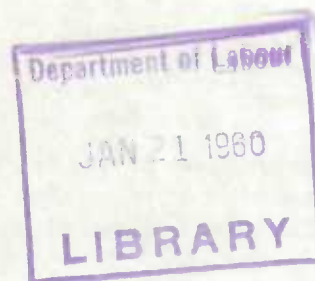

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

July, 1959

INTRODUCTION

Total staff strength of all federal government departments and corporations rose by 5,722 in July 1959 as compared with June. Earnings of these employees showed a gain of \$2,879,000. ~~43,011,000~~ Departments employed 2,381 more persons and paid out \$1,434,000 more than in June. Proprietary corporations recorded an increase of 3,115 employees and \$1,501,000 in payrolls.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The Canadian National Railways reported an increase in staff for the fifth consecutive month. Following the Polymer Corporation strike settlement in June almost 1,300 wage-earners returned to work during July. Some employees of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation received retroactive payments which have been included below.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

The second Session of Canada's 24th Parliament ended on July 18th, 1959 and resulted in the layoff of more than 300 salaried employees in the function "General Government - Legislative". Seasonal hirings resulted in an increase of 775 prevailing rate employees mainly in "Defense Services", "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game and (b) Lands". The principal seasonal increases in Casual employment were in "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - (a) Fish and Game (b) Lands and (c) Other".
