INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1959. Total staff strength declined by 1,668 in August, 1959 as compared with July, 1959 but was 3,545 higher than the August 1958 total. Employees in Departments decreased by 1,290 and in Proprietary Corporations by 220. Earnings of all employees of the Federal Government were \$2,124,000 lower than in July 1959 but increased by \$4,225,000 over August 1958. Those in Departments earned \$962,000 less while in Proprietary Corporations the decrease in employee earnings was \$1,130,000.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations decreased slightly in August 1959 as compared with July 1959 but were almost the same as in August, 1958. Earnings of these employees decreased \$1,142,000 in August 1959 compared with July but were \$2,488,000 or 5 p.c. higher than a year earlier.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Salaried, prevailing rate and casual employees were lower by 270, 735 and 233 respectively in the function "Defence Services" due to seasonal staff reductions by National Defence. Declines of 119 for prevailing rate and 106 for casual employees were recorded in the function "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Parks etc.". There were 179 fewer casuals in the function "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands etc.". Casual employees rose by 427 persons in "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" due to hirings by the departments of Transport and Public Works.
