INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1959.

Total staff strength declined by 2,782 in January 1960 as compared with December 1959. Earnings of staff decreased by \$1,905,000 from December 1959. Employment was down by 4,117 from comparable totals for January, 1959 but earnings of staff rose by \$2,085,000. The main changes recorded in January 1960 as compared with December 1959 were a) a decrease of 166 employees and \$230,000 in Departments, b) a decrease of 221 employees and \$55,000 in Agency Corporations and (c) a decrease of 2,428 staff and \$1,675,000 in Proprietary Corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations decreased by 2,666 in January, 1960 as compared with December, 1959. Earnings of these employees decreased by \$1,723,000 from December 1959. The principal changes recorded in January 1960 from December 1959 were a) seasonal decreases by the Canadian National Railways and the National Harbours Board and b) an increase of staff by the Trans-Canada Air Lines.

Using comparable figures there were 616 fewer employees in January, 1960 than in January, 1959 but the earnings of employees were up by \$1,749,000 in the same period. In comparing employees and earnings with those for the previous year or in using cumulative figures, employment data of staff located abroad (outside Canada) should be deducted for the months of November 1959 to January 1960. This is due to the fact that data pertaining to those employees were not included prior to November, 1959. At the end of January 1960, 8,942 employees of Agency and Proprietary Corporations were working outside Canada. These employees had earnings of \$4,427,000 during January 1960 and \$13,315,000 during November 1959 to January 1960.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Earnings of Christmas helpers in the Post Office Department are recorded as footnotes in this report.

The opening of the Third Session of the 24th Parliament in January 1960 resulted in a one month increase over December of more than 400 employees in the function "General Government - Legislative". Casual employees declined in the functions "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and "Education - Indian and Eskimo Schools etc." but rose in the function "Other - Post Office".

Total employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations declined by 3,501 in January 1960 as compared with January 1959. Salaried employment rose by 1,753 during the 12 month period and the main changes were increases of over 3,100 employees in the functions "General Government - Executive and Administrative", "Protection of Persons and Property - Police Protection", "Transportation and Communications - Airways", "Social Welfare - National Employment Services", "Other - Post Office" and decreases of over 2,000 employees in the functions "Defence Services" and "Transportation and Communications - Waterways". During the same period prevailing rate employees decreased by almost 2,000 mostly in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." In the one year period casual employees fell by over 3,400. The principal changes were decreases in the functions "Defence Services" and "Transportation and Communications - Waterways". No significant changes occured in Ships' Officers and Crews employment. A change-over of responsability for the operation of Canals on the Seaway System, from the department of Transport to the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority in April 1959, contributed to decreases in the function "Transportation and Communications -Waterways" of 711 salaried, 266 prevailing rate and 458 casual employees. Prevailing rate employees were more numerous last year in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks etc." due to a winter works program conducted by the National Parks Branch of the Northern Affairs and National Resources at that time.


