INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

This report includes the salary increases announced during November. It also includes some September, 1960 data for the department of National Defence. For detail see Part B, page 6.

Preliminary figures show that the total staff strength of the Federal Government declined by 1,510 during November, 1960 and by 3,407 during the last 12 month period. Earnings of these employees were down \$943,000 in November, 1960 as compared with October but up \$6,554,000 from November, 1959.

The decline in employment recorded during November, 1960 resulted from a decrease of 3,315 employees and \$1,626,000 in Proprietary Corporations which was only partly offset by increases of 694 employees and \$415,000 in Departments and 1,309 employees and \$302,000 in Departmental Corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and other Agencies declined by 3,513 or 2.5% in November, 1960 as compared with October, 1960 and 7,964 or 5.4% as compared with November, 1959. Earnings of these employees decreased by \$1,660,000 or 3.1% during the month and \$1,628,000 or 3.0% during the year.

The fall in employment from October, recorded in every province, was seasonal in nature and reported chiefly by the Canadian National Railways.

To make possible a comparison with cumulative totals for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) for the periods January, 1960 - October, 1960 and April, 1960 - October, 1960 are shown in footnotes 2/ and 3/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Available data for the Department of Forestry, which was established by proclamation on October 1, 1960, have been included for the first time in this report. Salary increases for a number of classes, announced during November and effective the first of July, August and October have been included in the earnings of Salaried employees for this month. These increases involved approximately 1,000 employees with estimated total monthly increases of \$50,000.

Some data pertaining to the department of National Defence were not available for inclusion in this report. In order to avoid delay in the release of approximate figures of total employment, September data were used for salaried staff of the Defence Research Board and prevailing rate, ships' officers and crews and casual staff in the entire department. A study of related data indicates that the revised figures for prevailing rate and casual employees will show an increase over these figures.

The number of salaried and casual employees increased substantially while the number of prevailing rate and ships' employees remained virtually unchanged during November, 1960. The principal changes recorded in November from October were a) an increase of salaried staff in the function "General Government - Legislative" due to the opening of the 4th session of the 24th Parliament on November 17th, b) a decrease of casual employees in the function "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and c) an increase of casual employees in the function "Social Welfare - National Employment Services".
