## INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

The quarterly statement of hirings and separations data for salaried employees, for the fourth quarter of 1960 will be included in the January, 1961 report.

This report includes some estimated figures for the Department of National Defence for which only partial data for December are available.

A number of employees which were not previously reported are included for the first time in this report. For detail see Part B, page 6.

A decrease of some 3,600 employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations was only partly offset by an increase of some 1,100 employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations and, as a result, an overall decrease of 2,522 employees occurred in December, 1960 as compared with November. Total earnings of these employees however, increased by \$752,000.

The total number of persons employed by the Government of Canada and its agencies remained virtually unchanged in December, 1960 as compared with December, 1959 but their earnings increased by almost \$7,200,000. Comparable cumulative totals show that they received some \$36,000,000 more during 1960 than 1959.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies declined by 3,607 or 2.6% in December, 1960 as compared with November, 1960 and 7,544 or 5.3% when contrasted with December, 1959. Earnings of these employees decreased by \$384,000 or 0.7% during the month and \$1,831,000 or 3.4% during the year. Comparable cumulative totals show that employees of these organizations received \$12,132,000 less in 1960 than in 1959.

The fall in employment during December, recorded in every province except Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia, was the result of decreases reported by the Canadian National Railways and the National Harbours Board.

To make possible a comparison with cumulative totals for the previous year figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) prior to November 1960 have been prepared and are shown in footnotes 2/ and 3/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

# PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Some prevailing rate employees of the Department of Veterans Affairs, which were not previously reported, have been included for the first time this month. They numbered 280 and had earnings of \$69,692 in December, 1960.

In order to avoid delay in the release of approximate figures of total employment, estimated figures have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development and prevailing rate, ships' officers and crew and casual staff in the entire department of National Defence.

The major changes recorded during December, 1960 were a) increases in prevailing rate employees in the function "Veterans' Pensions and Other Benefits" (due to the inclusion of Department of Veterans Affairs employees mentioned above) and in the function "Recreational and Cultural services - Parks etc." b) a decrease in ships' employees in the function "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and c) decreased numbers of casual employees in several functions, principally "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and "Other -Post Office". These were more than offset by substantial increases in the functions "Defence Services" and "Social Welfare - National Employment Services."

Regular earnings of all employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations increased by \$46,710,000 or 6.5% during 1960 as compared with 1959.


