

INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given in the report for April, 1959.

Total staff strength declined slightly in February, 1960 as compared with January, 1960 while employees earnings rose by \$334,000. Employment was down by 3,155 from comparable totals for February, 1959 but earnings of staff rose by \$1,908,000. The main changes recorded in February, 1960 as compared with January, 1960 were a) an increase of 238 employees and \$1,090,000 in Departments, b) a decrease of 594 employees and \$53,000 in Departmental Corporations and c) an increase of 185 employees and a decrease of \$701,000 in Proprietary Corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Total number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies increased slightly in February as compared with January. Earnings of these employees decreased by \$703,000 from January. An increase of staff by the Trans-Canada Air Lines and a decrease by the Canadian National Railways were the main reasons for the changes in staff recorded during February 1960.

To make possible a comparison with data for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) are shown in footnotes 2/, 3/ and 4/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Payments for overtime worked by salaried employees of the Post Office department at Christmas 1959 are included in Table 9 of this report. February, 1960 was the last month in which staff was reported by the Royal Commission on Energy Policies. This employment had been included departmentally under "Privy Council - Special".

Salaried employees increased mainly in the function "General Government - Executive and Administrative" due to the regular annual increase of staff in the Taxation Branch of National Revenue to handle income tax returns. Casual employees decreased mostly in the functions "Transportation and Communications - Waterways" and "Social Welfare - National Employment Services" but rose in the function "Defence Services". The departments of Labour, National Defence, Public Works and Transport were responsible for the changes in casual employment which were principally seasonal in nature.
