

# FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT APRIL 1960 

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## INTRODUCTLON

An explanation of how the statistics for: (1) Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies, and; (2) Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations are collected and maintained is given, together with other background detail, in Paxt C - "Explanatory Notes" commencing on page 23. Table 1 combines all employment reported in Parts A and B. Data on Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies is presented by province in Part A. That for Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations is summarized in Part B. Reference to the table of contents on page 3 will indicate the detail available in each. A table on hirings and separations of salaried employees is included quarterly. The classification by function is explained in detail on pages 25 to 29. The administrative classification is based upon the departmental establishment which is presented in the official Estimates of Canada, thus permitting the analyst to follow the growth and changes in employment of each department. Comparative analysis must take into consideration changes in departmental organization which occur. This process of change is taken into account in the analysis by function.

Some data pertaining to the department of National Defence for Apri1, 1960 were not received in time for inclusion in this report. In order to give approximate figures of total employment, March data were used for salaried staff of the Defence Research Board and for prevalling rate, ships' officers and crews and casual staff in the entire Department. March data were also used for retroactive and overtime payments to staff of the Department. A study of related data indicates that the number of salaried, prevailing rate and ships' officer and crew employees are unlikely to vary to any significant extent, while the number of casual employees may decrease slightly.

During April, 1960 total staff strength of the Federal Government including all its corporations and agencies declined by approximately 2,100 from March, 1960 and by almost 3,700 from comparable totals for April, 1959. Earnings of these employees increased by $\$ 672,000$ from March, 1960 and by $\$ 2,133,000$ from comparable totals for April, 1959. The number of employees decreased in Departments by 179 from March 1960 in Departmental Corporations by 99, in Proprietary Corporations by 2,170 and increased in Agency Corporations by 310 and in other Agencies by 4 . Earnings of those employees Increased in Departments by $\$ 1,285,000$, in Departmental Corporations by $\$ 23,000$, in Agency Corporations by $\$ 255,000$ and decreased in Proprietary Corporations by $\$ 899,000$ and in Other Agencies, by $\$ 2,000$.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The total number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies in April was 1,856 less than in March. Earnings of these employees decreased by $\$ 636,000$ from March. The decline occured mainly in Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, Decreases by Canadian Arsenais Ltd. and the Canadian National Railways more than offset increases by the National Harbours Board, the Northern Transportation Company Ltd. and Trans-Canada Airlines.

To make possible a comparison with data for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) are shown in footnotes $2 /$ and 3/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

## PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

A salary increase effective April 1, 1960 has been inciudet in the earmings af salaried omployees. It is estimated that some 43,000 employees had salary increases amounting to \$1,037,000.

The number of salaried employees decreased while the number of prevailing rate, ships' officer and crew and casual employees increased in April, 1960 as compared with March, 1960. The principal changes recorded in April from March were a) decreases of salaried staff in the functions "Defence Services", "General Government-Executive and Administrative" and "Transportation and Communications Telephone, etc." and b) increases of prevailing rate employees in the functions "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, etc." and "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands, etc."

Following is an outline of the principal changes included in the Estimates for the fiscal year April 1, 1960 to March 31, 1961. Changes within a service (services as outlined for each department in tables 8 and 9) are not detailed.

National Health and Welfare: "Civil Defence" now under "General".
Northern Affairs and National Resources: "National Parks Branch" includes a new service - "National Aviation Museum".

Privy Council: "Rmergency Measures Organization" has been separated from "Special". The "Royal Commission on Coal" established under authority of an Order-In-Council dated October 6, 1959 has been included for the first time and is shown under "Special".
Transport: "The St. Lawrence River Joint Board of Engineeks ~ Canadian Section" has been abolished.

## Note re Revisions to March data

As originally published the March report included some February data for the department of National Defence. The major adjustments resulting from inclusion of March information are increases; (1) of 1,323 casual employees and (2) of $\$ 325,925$ regular earnings for prevailing rate and $\$ 360,999$ for casual staff.

[^3]PART $C$<br>EXPLANATORY NOTES

The present statistics are the result of a monthly survey of Government of canada employment published since April, 1952. This monthly report has had three different titles. In the period April, 1952 to August, 1953 it was known as "Government of Canada Employment and Payrolls". In the period. September, 1953 to March, 1954 the report was known as "Federal Government Employment and Payrolls" and since April, 1954 the name of the publication has been "Federal Government Employment". The monthly statistical series replaces one formerly issued annually under several different titles the first of which was "Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". This report was issued annually for the fiscal years ended March 31,1925 to 1931. Combined reports with the above title were issued for the fiscal years ended 1932 to $1934 ; 1935$ and 1936 ; and 1937 to 1939 . The title of the report was changed to "Sumary Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". Reports under this title were issued in a combined form for the fiscal years ended 1940 to 1942 and for each of the fiscal years ended 1943 to 1948. The title was again changed to "Summary Statistics, Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls" for the year ended March 31, 1949. For the years ended March 31, 1950, 1951 and 1952 three reports were issued entitled "Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls".

The present monthly report is composed of three parts. Introduction sumarizes, in Table 1 , data on all persons employed by the Federal Government and its agencies. Part A presents, in Table 2, employment data of agency and proprietary corporations and other agencles by province. A list of these bodies appears on page 24 of this section. Part B consists of Tables 3 to lo which present statistics relating to the departmental branches, services and corporations listed in the Financial Administration Act plus a few which are not listed therein. Data on these is presented in Tables 3 to lo as detailed in the table of contents on page 3. A table of numbers and rates of hirings and separations for salaried employees is included quarterly.

Statistics in the current report are presented in a form which is intended to facilitate, among other uses, direct comparisions between 1) numbers employed (reported in this publication), and 2) the number of positions established for each administrative branch of government (published in the Estimates of Canada).

The statistics relate only to civilian employees and to members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Force (which being a semi-military organization are not considered as being civilian). Members of the Armed Services are excluded. Deputy Ministers are included in the staffs of Departmental Services but Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor-General are excluded. For Boards, Comissions and other bodies, those members or officers serving on a full-time basis and whose salaries are fixed accordingly, are included, whereas directors or board members, who are pald on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honourarium for their services are excluded.

A description of the sources of data and the bases upon which the information is submitted and prepared for use is contained in the following outline.

INTRODUCTION
TOTAL FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT AND PAYROLLS (TABLE 1)
Table 1 groups all employees of: 1) departmental branches, services and corporations, and 2) agency and proprietary corporations and other agencles. Each of these two categorles are broken down into its component parts resulting in five main groups. These are: 1) departments, 2) departmental corporations, 3) agency corporations, 4) proprietary corporations, and 5) other agencies. The first two combine overtime earnings and retroactive payments reported with regular earnings to obtain gross earnings while the latter three record as gross earnings all moneys earned by the employees covered.

## PART A

## AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES (TABLE 2)

Statistics for these organizations are collected in two ways: 1) directly from the corporation or agency; 2) through the Employment Section of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The statistics reported do not permit a presentation by class, i.e. salaried, casuals and others, etc., hence com-
posite figures are published. In most cases, employees reported represent the staff strength during the final pay period of the month. Gross earnings are reported and they accordingly include overtime and other types of special payments in addition to regular salaries and wages. 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## Salaried employees

Salarled employees as used in this report means all persons paid on the basis of a stated annual salary rate, with the exception of the group known as "ships' officers". The latter group are excluded because of their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act. For a more complete definition of "salaried employees" see the Glossary.

The basic data is recorded in two ways: 1) by employee; 2) by group of employees.

1) By employee:

Individual position records are maintained for the majority of salaried positions in the departmental branches, services and corporations of the Government of Canada (the remainder will be treated under "2) by group of employees"). The position record cards contain data on the occupants of these positions. The records are amended monthly on the basis of documents received authorizing changes concerning positions and/or their occupants - thus affording a count of persons employed on the last day of the month. Because of an unoidable time lag in the routing of position and personnel changes through normal channels, it is not always possible to include all changes applicable to any month in statistics for that month. The count of employees for a given month, therefore, will not always represent the exact staff strength at the end of that month. Regular earnings, being based on annual salary rates, will not necessarily equal the actual amounts paid in salaries for any given month. These factors are not, however, significant enough to seriously affect the usefulness of the statistics.
2) By group of employees:

No individual position records are maintained for the remainder of salaried employees in departmental branches, services and corporations. Statistics on these employees are collected by means of forms or statements, giving: the staff strength at the end of the month, regular earnings earned during the month including earnings of those off-strength at the end of the month, retroactive payments and overtime payments. Statistics on non-salaried employees in departmental branches, services and corporations are collected, in all cases, by means of forms or statements. These sumary reports based on payroll and other records indicate the staff strength, regular earnings, retroactive payments and overtime payments. prevalling rate and casual "locally-engaged" employees are also reported by this means. The ships"万fficers, which are in fact salaried employees, are included in the non-salaried group owing to their - pocial treatment under the Financial Administration Act.

## CLASSIFICATION BY FUNCTION

The statistics of departmental branches, services and corporations are classified in tables 6 and 7 by function. The purpose of providing a classification by function is to supply a means of studying the operations of governments without the complications resulting from differences in administrative establishment which occur from time to time in each government and between governments. This analysis is useful in three ways. First it permits a detailed study of employment by the Government of Canada according to the main purposes or functions. Since these functions are not subject to the periodic changes which alter the administrative structure of the government it is possible to develop a statistical series which, with minor exceptions, is consistent over an extend period of time. Second, since differences in administrative establishments are eliminated it is possible to make meaningful comparisons between federal government expenditures on employment and similar expenditures by other levels of government. Third, an analysis of the relationship between expeaditures on employment and total expenditures can be made with regard to each function. The use of percentages will facilitate
comparisons especially between levels of goverment.
The classification by function reflects the purpose served by the expenditure, and employment statistics presented on this basis have been classified in accordance with concepts evolved by the Public Finance Section of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the presentation of financial statistics. The following listing shows how the administrative detail has been applied to the various functions and will serve to indicate clearly the meaning of each function. Since "other" is actually a group of functions, the component parts have been listed separately so that each may be self-evident.

## COMPARABILITY BEIWEEN NLMBERS AND EARNINGS

The user of these statistics is advised to avoid making direct comparisons between the numbers of persons reported and the earnings reported, the reason for this being that numbers relate to the last day of the month wherever possible and otherwise to the final pay period of the month. Since in certain categories, especially casual employment, a very considerable fluctuation in numbers employed may occur during any month, it may be seen that a comparison between the earnings of all persons employed during the month and the numbers on strength at the end of the month would, in many cases, not be valld.

## COMPARABILITY WITH FORMER SURVEY

The statistical series produced on an annual basis for the years 1925 to 1952 was intended to include the number of permanent and temporary employees in the general administrative government services (this broadly speaking, included those coming under the Civil Service Act). In addition, the earnings of certain classes of employees referred to as "non-enumerated" classes were shown in the publication. The survey did not include a count of these "non-enumerated" classes. Since there was a distinct variation in the interpretation by departments of what constituted these groups there resulted differences between departments in the coverage of employees and earnings included in the annual series. The monthly series which comenced in April, 1952 includes employees not formerly counted in the tabulations as well as a number of government services not previously included, and consequently the statistics should not be compared with the former annual series.

## GLOSSARY OF PRINCIPAL TERMS USED

1. Department: Also known as departmental services, departments are the named divisions of the Goverment of Canada as defined in the Financial Administration Act.
2. Crown Corporations: A Crown Corpration is a corporatior which is ultimately accountable, through a Minister, to Parliament for the conduct of its affairs, and includes the corporations named in the Financial Administration Act as departmental corporations, agency corporations and proprietary corporations.
3. Departmental Corporation: A Crown Corporation which is a servant or agent of Her Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for administrative, supervisory, or regulatory services of a governmental nature.
4. Agency Corporation: A Crown Corporation which is an agent of Her Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for the management of trading or service operations on a quasi-commercial basis, or for the management of procurement, construction or disposal activities on behalf of Her Majesty in right of Canada.
5. Proprietary Corporation: A Crown Corporation which (1) is responsible for the management of lending or financial operations, or for the management of comercial and industrial operations involving the production of dealing in goods and the supplying of services to the public, and (2) is ordinarily required to conduct its operations without appropriations from the Federal Treasury.
6. Salaried employee: An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board.
7. Prevailing rate employee: An employee employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Prevalling Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board. The positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
8. Ships' officer: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board and these positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada.
9. Ships crew employee: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a silp that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. A monthly rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Ships' Crews Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board and these positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada.
10. Casual and other employee: All employees in Departments and Departmental corporations of the Government of Canada who are not defined as Salaried, Prevailiag Rate, Ships' Officer or Ships' Crew employees.
11. Locally-Engaged employees: These are persons, usually citizens of foreign countries, employed by the Goverment of Canada to perform duties in their country. Their salary or wage is stated in the currency of the country where they are employed. Salarfed locally-engaged employees are those per sons occupying positions: (1) in classes having the suffix U.K. 1.e., Clerk 2 (UK), Stenographer $l$ (UK), etc.; (2) as Assistants. While most are engaged as Salaried or prevailing rate staff some locally-engaged employees are employed on a casual basis and are paid from the vote "Casuals and

Others". The term "locally-engaged" excludes Canadian employees posted abroad.
12. Regular earnings: The basic pay of employees excluding any special payments such as overtime, living allowances, etc. All regular earnings for the month, including those of persons offstrength at the end of the month are included in the tables where the title is used.
13. Earnings: As used in tables 1 \& 2 this term means gross earnings including overtime, retroactive pay and other special payments in addition to regular earnings.
14. Hiring: The initial appointment of a person to the reporting Department whether as a new employee in the Government Service or by transfer from another Department. Movements within a Department are not considered as hirings.
15. Separations: The termination of service of an employee in the reporting Department by leaving the Government Service or by transfer to another Department. Movements within a Department are not considered as separations.
