INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

Some data pertaining to the department of National Defence for June, 1960 were not received in time for inclusion in this report. In order to avoid delay in the release of approximate figures of total employment, May data were used for salaried staff of the Defence Research Board and for prevailing rate, ships' officers and crews and casual staff in the entire department. A study of related data indicates that the number of salaried and ships' officer and crew employees are unlikely to vary to any significant extent, while the number of casual and prevailing rate employees is expected to increase substantially. Comparisons made between the data here published and those for previous months should make allowance for this factor.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies was almost 3,500 more in June than May, 1960. Increases were recorded in every province and were due principally to seasonal hirings by the Canadian National Railways. Earnings of these employees rose by \$731,000 from May, 1960.

To make possible a comparison with data for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) are shown in footnotes 2/, 3/ and 4/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

The salary increases announced during June, 1960 and effective the first of that month have been included in the earnings of salaries employees. It is estimated that some 6,400 employees had increases amounting to \$470,000 for the month.

The number of employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations increased in June, 1960 as compared with May, 1960. The majority of these increases were of a seasonal nature and recorded mainly in the functions "General Government - Executive and Administrative", "Transportation and Communications - a) Airways and b) Waterways", "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, etc.", "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - a) Fish and Game, b) Forests, c) Lands etc., d) Minerals and Mines and e) Other" and "Other - Post Office". The only other important change over last month was a decrease in the function "Social Welfare - National Employment Services".

Preliminary figures show that total staff strength was 1,533 less in June, 1960 than June, 1959. This is believed to be the result of using May data for part of National Defence and it is expected that revised figures for June, 1960 will be comparable to June, 1959.

The quarterly statement of hiring and separation data for salaried employees is included in table 10.

Notes and Definitions

Department - For purposes of this table only, a department is defined as a departmental branch, service or corporation having a separately administered personnel office.

Hiring - The initial appointment of an individual to the reporting department.

Separation - Termination of service of an individual in the reporting department.

Average Employment - The mean monthly average number of employees in each department during the quarter.

Monthly Average - (Hirings and Separations) - The arithmetic mean i.e. one third of the actual hirings and separations for the quarter.

Monthly Rate per 1,000 Employees - (Hirings and Separations) - The rate is computed by the following formula:

Monthly Average (number hired or separated) x 1000


