INTRODUCTION

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

At the end of September, 1960 the labour force of the Federal Government combining all its departments, corporations and agencies stood at 346,084, down 4,243 from August, 1960 but higher by 3,463 than September, 1959. Earnings paid during the month under review amounted to \$121,983,000, down \$3,323,000 from the previous month but up \$8,539,000 over September, 1959.

The most significant drop from August 1960 data occurred in departments, down by 1,460 employees and \$492,000 in earnings, and, in proprietary corporations, down 2,465 employees and \$2,947,-000 in earnings.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency Corporations, Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies declined in September, 1960 as compared with August, 1960 following an annual seasonal pattern where peak employment is reached during July and August, declines in September.

During September, 1960 employees decreased by 2,679 from August, 1960 and by 7,119 from September, 1959. The earnings paid to employees were \$2,802,000 lower in September as compared with August, 1960 and \$2,162,000 less than September, 1959. Aggregate earnings for the period January 1 to September 30,1960 were lower by \$5,916,000 than the same period last year.

Decreases in September, 1960 from the preceding month occurred in every province and was the result of seasonal decreases reported by a number of corporations, principally by the Canadian National Railways. This corporation also had lower employment in September, 1960 than in September, 1959.

The Canadian Arsenals Limited and the Eldorado Mining and Refining Limited had smaller staffs than in September 1959 but these were more than offset by increases in staff reported by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the Trans-Canada Air Lines.

To make possible a comparison with data for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) are shown in footnotes 2/ and 3/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Preliminary figures indicate that employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations decreased by 1,564 in September, 1960 from August, 1960 but increased by 2,141 from September 1959. The decrease from August is largely the result of a seasonal decline common to a number of departments, especially the Department of Agriculture. Comparison of staff strength between September, 1960 and September, 1959 shows higher employment in a number of departments particularly in Labour, Post Office and Transport. Earnings paid during the six month period April 1 to September 30, 1960 increased by 6.5 per cent or \$23,900,727 to \$391,021,388 over the same period of 1959. The major reason for the rise was increases to salaried employees announced at various dates during the period.

During September, 1960 some 6,450 employees in the Royal Canadian Mounted Police received an estimated \$225,000 in salary increase.

This report includes August, 1960 data for part of National Defence and it is expected that the revised data for September, 1960 will show somewhat lower employment for that department.

The quarterly statement of hiring and separation data for salaried employees is included in Table 10. Beginning with this issue the data on National Defence is divided in two parts, Main Department and Defence Research Board.


