NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

INTRODUCTION

The quarterly statement of hirings and separations data for salaried employees, for the fourth quarter of 1960 is shown on pages 22 to 25 of this report.

This report includes some estimated figures for the Department of National Defence for which only partial data for January are available. For detail see Part B, page 6.

The total number of employees of the Government of Canada including its corporations and agencies increased only slightly in January, 1961 as compared with December, 1960 but was 3,472 higher than January, 1960. Earnings decreased by \$386,000 from December, 1960 but were \$8,478,000 higher than January, 1960.

The main changes recorded during January, 1961 were a) an increase of 1,899 employees and a decrease of \$154,000 in Departments and b) a decrease of 1,408 employees and \$241,000 in Proprietary Corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies decreased by 1,529 or 1.1% in January, 1961 as compared with December, 1960 and by 6,079 or 4.3% as compared with January, 1960. Earnings of these employees were \$317,000 or 0.6% lower than December, 1960 and \$649,000 or 1.3% lower than January, 1960.

The decline in employment during January, 1961 over December, 1960 was most substantial in Saskatchewan and Ontario, whereas New Brunswick recorded a sizeable increase. These variations are attributed mainly to the Canadian National Railways.

To make possible a comparison with the cumulative total for the previous year, figures excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) prior to November, 1960 have been prepared and are shown in footnote 2/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In order to avoid delay in the release of approximate figures of total employment, estimated figures have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development and prevailing rate, ships' officers and crew and casual staff in the entire department of National Defence.

Preliminary figures for January, 1961 indicate that the total staff increased by 1,832 employees during the month. The most important increase was recorded in casual employees in the function "Defence Services". Other notable changes recorded during the month were a) an increase in salaried employees in the function "General Government - Executive and Administrative" b) an increase in prevailing rate employees in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, etc." c) increases in casual employees in the functions "Transportation and Communications - Airways" and "Other - Post Office" and d) a decrease in casual employees in the function "Social Welfare - National Employment Services".


