NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1960.

INTRODUCTION

This report includes some estimated figures for the Department of National Defence for which March data are only partially available. For detail see Part B, page 6.

Preliminary figures indicate that the total staff of the Federal Government, including its corporations and agencies decreased by 190 in March, 1961 as compared with February, 1961. This resulted from decreases of 1,734 employees in Departments and 245 in Departmental Corporations which were partly offset by increases of 109 in Agency Corporations, 1676 in Proprietary Corporations and 4 in other Agencies. During March, 1961 the earnings of these employees decreased by \$1,248,000 in Departments and increased by \$6,000 in Departmental Corporations, \$59,000 in Agency Corporations, \$3,091,000 in Proprietary Corporations and \$8,000 in Other Agencies resulting in an overall increase of \$1,916,000. The staff total decreased by 345 and the earnings of these employees increased by \$8,311,000 in March, 1961 as compared with March, 1960.

Comparable figures show that the total earnings of Federal Government employees for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1961 was up by \$54,267,000 or 4% from the fiscal year ended March 31, 1960.

Agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies recorded a drop of 2.9 p.c. in payroll for the 1960-61 fiscal year from 1959-60. Departmental branches, services and corporations on the other hand showed an increase of 9.9 p.c. in amounts paid to employees.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

After declining for six consecutive months, employment in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and other agencies increased by 1,789 in March, 1961 as compared with February, 1961 but was still 6,117 employees fewer than in March, 1960. Earnings of these employees in March, 1961 were up \$3,158,000 from February and down \$88,000 from March, 1960.

The rise in employment during March, 1960 was mainly due to Canadian National Railways increases in New Brunswick and Quebec.

Comparable totals show that the earnings for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1961 were \$18,163,000 less than those for the previous fiscal year.

To make possible a comparison with the total for the previous year, cumulative earnings excluding staff located abroad (outside Canada) for the period April-October, 1960 are shown in footnote 2/. This has been necessitated because data pertaining to the staff abroad were not included prior to November, 1959.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Employment data of the Royal Commission on Government Organization, which was established on September 16, 1960 by order-in-council, have been included for the first time in this report. These data are included in tables 6 and 7 under the function "General Government - Executive and Administrative" and in tables 8 and 9 under "Privy Council - Special".

In order to avoid delay in the release of total employment data, preliminary estimates have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development, and prevailing rate, ships officers and crews and casual staff in the entire department of National Defence.

Preliminary figures indicate that the total number of employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations in March, 1961 was 1,979 less than February, 1961 and 5,772 higher than March, 1960.

During March, 1961 the number of Salaried employees increased slightly over February totals the number of casual employees decreased substantially and the number of prevailing rate and ships' employees remained virtually unchanged. The increase in salaried staff was recorded mainly in the functions "General Government - Executive and Administrative" and "Protection of Persons and Property - Police Protection". Casual employees decreased principally in the function "Defence Services" and "Social Welfare - National Employment Services".

During the fiscal year 1960-61 the majority of departments led by Northern Affairs and National Resources, Post Office and Transport reported increases in staff. The only notable exceptions were the departments of National Defence and National Revenue which had fewer employees.
