#### NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1961.

#### INTRODUCTION

This report includes some estimated figures for the Department of National Defence for which August, 1961 data are only partially available. For detail, see tables in Part B.

The total staff strength of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies, numbered 354,870 for August, 1961. This represents a decrease, from July, 1961, of 1,180 employees which is accounted for mainly by a drop of 730 employees in Departmental Branches and Services and one of 285 in Proprietary Corporations. Comparable totals for the same months of 1960 indicate a similar but milder trend where employment decreased by 578 to 350,327 in August, 1960 from 350,905 in July, 1960.

Analysis of the 4,543 employees increase from August, 1960 to August, 1961 indicates a substantial rise in staff in Departmental Branches and Services, up by 6,952 but offset to some extent by a drop of 3,026 employees in Proprietary Corporations. Other changes were: Departmental Corporations, up by 556; Other Agencies, up by 103, and; Agency Corporations, down by 42.

Total staff earnings amounted to \$130,366,000 for August, 1961, down by \$1,137,000 from July, 1961 but up by \$5,060,000 over August, 1960. Earnings for the first eight months of 1961 exceeded the billion dollar mark at \$1,002,321,000, up by 68,774,000 as compared with the same period of 1960.

## PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies had a roll of 145,914 employees in August, 1961. This was a decrease of 339 employees from 146,253 in July, 1961 and of 2,965 from 148,879 employees in August, 1960. The decline from July, 1961 was mostly due to Trans-Canada Air Lines reduction of staff, especially in the provinces of Quebec and Manitoba and to a lesser extent in Ontario. The Canadian National Railways recorded a substantial decrease in Quebec offset by a good increase in Ontario which resulted in a small overall rise in staff numbers.

Employee earnings amounted to \$58,696,000 in August, 1961, down by \$1,009,000 from \$59,705,000 in July, 1961. The July payroll included approximately one million dollars retroactive pay reported by the Canadian National Railways. The August report of that Company included a very small amount of retroactive pay and total payroll consequently decreased. Cumulative earnings for the first eight months of 1961 amounted to \$439,516,000, up by \$11,577,000 over the corresponding period of 1960.

#### PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In order to avoid further delay in the release of this report, estimated figures have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development, and, prevailing rate, ships' officers and crews, and casual staff in the entire Department of National Defence.

The Royal Commission on Health Services is included in this report for the first time. Six employees were reported. This Commission is included in the function tables (6 and 7) under "Health - General" and in the administrative analysis (tables 8 and 9) under "Privy Council - Special".

The staff strength of departmental branches, services and corporations numbered 208,956 in August, 1961, down by 841 from the 209,797 in July, 1961 but higher by 7,508 than in August, 1960. Staff earnings amounted to \$71,670,000 in August, 1961, down by \$129,000 from July, 1961 but higher by \$3,327,000 than in August, 1960.

Analysis of employment for August, 1961 as compared with July, 1961 reveals an estimated decrease of 1,900 employees (including almost 1,500 prevailing rate staff, in the function "Defence Services" most of which represents a drop in Summer Training of Militia and Cadets, especially for Army and Air Services. Casual employees increased in the functions "National Resources and Primary Industries - Land: Settlement and Agriculture", and, "Other"; in "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, Beaches and Other Recreational Areas"; and in "Transportation and Communications - Waterways". Salaried employees increased in the function "General Government - Research, Planning and Statistics", resulting from additions to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in connection with the 1961 Census. Review by type of employees indicates a decrease of 1,671 prevailing rate and an increase of 546 casual employees. Staff numbers were considerably lower in Ontario, Quebec and Alberta and higher in British Columbia and the Yukon and Northwest Territories.
