

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April, 1961.

INTRODUCTION

This report includes some estimated figures for the Department of National Defence for which September, 1961 data are only partially available. For detail, see tables in Part B.

Employees of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies, numbered 349,138 at the end of September, 1961. This represents a decline from August, 1961 of 5,732 employees resulting mainly from reductions of 3,135 in departmental branches, services and of 2,109 in proprietary corporations; the other three groups of employees decreased less substantially. The decline in staff from August to September is mainly attributable to a seasonal reduction in certain activities following the peak months of July and August. The September, 1961 total was up 1.4 p.c. from the 344,362 employed in September, 1960. This year-to-year increase resulted from the employment of approximately 7,000 more persons by departments which more than offset a decrease of almost 2,700 in staff of proprietary corporations. Departmental corporations employed some 400 more staff than a year ago.

Total staff earnings for the month of September, 1961 amounted to \$127,160,000, down 2.5 p.c. or \$3,206,000 from August, 1961 but up 4.5 p.c. or \$5,449,000 from September, 1960. Earnings for the first nine months of 1961 amounted to \$1,129,481,000, up 7.0 p.c. or \$74,223,000 from the corresponding 1960 month.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies had a roll of 143,568 employees in September, 1961. There were thus 2,346 fewer employees than in August, 1961 and 2,632 fewer when compared with September, 1960.

The decline from August, 1961 was due in most part to a general reduction of staff by the Canadian National Railways System especially in Ontario, Quebec and the United States. Also contributory to this decline, though, to a minor extent were staff reductions by Atomic Energy of Canada Limited, Northern Transportation Company Limited, and Trans-Canada Air Lines.

Total staff earnings for the month under review amounted to \$56,131,000 down by \$2,565,000 or 4.4 p.c. from August, 1961 mainly due, of course, to the Canadian National Railways substantial staff reduction. On the other hand the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation reported retroactive payments in excess of \$100,000. Earnings went up by \$1,970,000 from September, 1960.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

In order to avoid further delay in the release of this report, estimated figures have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development, and, prevailing rate, ships' officers and crews, and casual staff in the entire Department of National Defence.

Employees of Departmental branches, services and corporations numbered 205,570 in September, 1961, down 1.6 p.c. or 3,336 from August, 1961 but 3.7 p.c. or 7,408 higher than in September, 1960. Total employee earnings for September, 1961 amounted to \$71,029,000, down by 0.9 p.c. or \$641,000 from August, 1961 but 5.1 p.c. or \$3,478,000 higher than in September, 1960.

The reduction of staff from August, 1961 to September, 1961 is generally attributed to reduced seasonal activities. Analysis of the data indicates a substantial decline of employees in the function "Defence Services", most of which result from a drop in summer employment and summer training of militia and cadets in National Defence; a decrease in the function "General Government - Executive and Administrative", mostly seasonal in nature; a drop in the function "General Government - Research, Planning and Statistics" resulting from a reduction in Dominion Bureau of Statistics Census employees; a seasonal drop in the function "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, Beaches and Other Recreational Areas"; and a decrease in the general function "Natural Resources and Primary Industries" involving seasonal reduction offset partly by the employment of short term employees in the Prairie provinces.

The decline from August is reflected in the four types of employees, especially salaried employees which dropped by 1,590, prevailing rate by 977 and casuals by 799. There were fewer employees in every province except Newfoundland. The drop was most significant in Ontario where staff was down by 1,340 to 87,419. Staff employed outside Canada increased slightly.
