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## NOTE

## INTRODUCTION

The quarterly statement of hirings and separations data for salarled employees for the first quarter of 1962 is included in this report.

Some estimated figures are used for the Department of National Defence, for which April 1962 data are only partially available. For detall, see tables under part B.

Preliminary figures, ( 336,991 in April 1962) indicate that the total staff of the Government of Canada, including its agencies and corporations was almost unchanged from the March count and was higher by just 0.8 per cent or 2874 persons than in April 1961.

Employee earnings for the months under review amounted to $\$ 125,612,000 ; \$ 127,300,000 ;$ and $\$ 118,731,000$, following the employee trend.

Staff strength was higher in April in three of the five groups of federal organizations. The wost significant changes were in Agency Corporations, which increased by 442 frow 8,975 in March 1962, due, mostly, to seasonal fluctuations; and in Departwental Branches and Services which decreased by 600 from 189,552 , in the previous month.

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The number of employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies at 133,179 in April 1962 was 557 higher than in March, and 512 lower when compared with April 1961.

Earnings of these employees in April 1962 amounted to $\$ 53,615,000 ; \$ 53,830,000$ in March 1962, and $\$ 50,103,000$ in April of the previous year.

The largest employer, Canadian National Railways, recorded a decrease while the National Capital Comission, the National Harbours Board and Trans-Canada Airways employed additional staff, some of which were required as a result of the opening of harbours for the season of navigation.

## HART E - DERARMENTAL BRANERES, SEKVICES AND CURPORATLUNS

In order to avoid further delay in the release of this report, estimated figures have been included for salaried staff of Defence Research and Development, and, prevailing rate, ships officers and crews, and casual staff of the entire Department of National Defence.

Employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations totalled 203,812 at the end of April 1962, which represents a decrease of 649 from the previous month, and an increase of 3,386 over April 1961. Total earmings of these employees amounted to $\$ 71,996,000$ for April 1962 , a decrease of $\$ 1,474,000$ from March 1962 and an increase of $\$ 3,367,000$ over April of the preceding year.

Analysis of the April 1962 data with those of March 1962, by function, indicates: (I) an increase of approximately 250 casual employees in the function "Defence Services"; (2) a decrease of about 160 casual employees in "Social Welfare - National Employment Services"; (3) a seasonal increase in casual employment of "Recreational and Cultural Services - Parks, Beaches, etc."; (4) an increase in casual and prevailing rate employees of "Natural Resources and Primary Industries - Lands: Settlement and Agriculture"; (5) an increase in prevalling rate and a decrease in casual employment of "Other Natural Resources and Primary Industries".

Due to the dissolution of Parliament April 9th, 1962, galaried ewployees in the function "General Government - Legislative", decreased from the previous month.

Effective April 1, 1962, all personnel of the Royal Comission on Railway Problems were trans= ferred to the Royal Comission on Health Services.

[^10]The present statistics are the result of a monthly survey of Government of Canada employment published since April 1952. This monthly report has had three different titles. In the period April 1952 to August 1953 it was known as "Government of Canada Employment and Payrolls". In the period September 1953 to March 1954 the report was known as "Federal Goverment Employment and Payrolls" and since April 1954 the name of the publication has been "Federal Government Employment". The monthly statistical series replaces one formerly issued annually under several different titles, the first of which was "Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". This report was issued annually for the fiscal years ended March 31, 1925 to 1931. Combined reports with the above title were issued for the fiscal years ended 1932 to $1934 ; 1935$ and 1936 ; and 1937 to 1939. The t1tle of the report was changed to "Sumary Statistics of the Civil Service of Canada". Reports under this title were issued in a combined form for the Eiscal years ended 1940 to 1942 and for each of the fiscal years ended 1943 to 1948. The title was again changed to "Summary Statistics, Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls" for the year ended March 31, 1949. For the years ended March 31, 1950, 1951 and 1952 three reports were issued entitled "Federal Civil Service Employment and Payrolls".

The present monthly report is composed of three parts. Introduction sumarizes, in Table 1 , data on all persons employed by the Federal Goverment and its agencies. Part A presents, in Table 2 , employment data of agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies by province. A list of these bodies appears on page 32 of this section. Part B consists of Tables 3 to 11 which present statistics relating to the departmental branches, services and corporations listed in the Financial Administration Act plus a few which are not listed therein. Data on these is presented in Tables 3 to 11 as detailed in the table of contents on page 3 . The table on numbers and rates of hirings and separations for salaried employees is included quarterly.

Statistics are presented in a form which is intended to facilitate, among other uses, direct comparisons between 1) numbers employed (reported in this publication), and 2) the number of positions established for each administrative branch of government (published in the Estimates of Canada).

The statistics relate only to civilian employees and to members of the Royal Canadian Mounted police Force (which being a semi-military organization are not considered as being civilian). Members of the Armed Services are excluded. Deputy Ministers are included in the staffs of Departmental Services but Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor-General are excluded. Members of parliament and Senators are also omitted from these tables. For Boards, Commssions and other bodies, those members or officers serving on a full-time basis and whose salaries are fixed accordingly, are included, whereas directors or board members, who are pald on a per diem basis or who recelve a nominal honorarlum for their services are excluded.

A description of the sources of data and the means by which the information is submitted and prepared for use is contained in the following outline.

## INTRODUCTION - TOTAL FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT AND PAYROLLS (TABLE 1)

Table 1 groups all employees of: 1) agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies, and 2) departmental branches, services and corporations. Each of these two categories is broken down into its component parts resulting in Eive main groups. These are: 1) agency corporations, 2) proprietary corporations, 3) other agencies, 4) departmental branches and services, and 5) departmental corporations. The first three record as gross earnings all moneys earned by the employees covered while the latter two combine overtime eamings and retroactive payments reported with regular earninge to obtain gross earnings.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES (TABLE 2)
Statistics for these organizetions are collected in two weys: 1) directly from the corporation or agency; 2) through the Employment Section of the Dominion Buresu of Statistics. The statistics reported do not permit a presentation by class, i.e. salaried, casuals and others, etc., hence composite tigures are published. In most cases, employees reported represent the staff strength during the final pay period of the month. Gross eamings are reported and they accordingly include overtime and other types of special payments in addition to regular salaries and wages. The Agency and Proprietary Corporations are listed in the Financial Administration Act under Schedules $C$ and D respectively. The Glossary on page 38 of this report contains definitions of these two types of corporations. The "Other Agencies" though not listed or defined in the Financial Administration Act are nevertheless organizations of the Crown.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS (TABLES 3 TO 11)

## Salaried employees

Salaried employees as used in this report means all persons paid on the basis of a stated annual salary rate, with the exception of the group known as "ships" officers". The latter group are excluded because of their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act. For a more complete definition of "salaried employees" see the Glossary.

The basic data is recorded in two ways: 1) by employee; 2) by group of employees.

1) By employee:

Individual position records are maintained for the majority of salaried positions in the departmental branches, services and corporations of the Government of canada (the remainder will be treated under "2) by group of employees"). The position record cards contain data on the occupants of these positions. The records are amended monthly on the basis of documents received authorizing changes concerning positions and/or their occupants - thus affording a count of persons employed on the last day of the month. Because of an unavoidable time lag in the routing of position and personnel changes through nomal channels, it is not always possible to include all changes in the appropriate month. The count of employees for a given month, therefore, will not always represent the exact staff strength at the end of that month. Regular earnings, being based on the annual salary rates, of employees on strenght at the month's end, will not necessarily equal the actual amounts paid in salaries during a month. These factors are not, however, sufficiently significant to seriously affect the validity of the statistics.
2) By group of employees:

No individual position records are maintalned for the remainder of salaried employees in departmental branches, services and corporations. Statistics on these employees are collected by means of forms or statements, giving: the staff strength at the end of the month, regular earnings earned
during the month, including earnings of those off-strength at the end of the month, retroactive payments and overtime payments. The following report in this manner:

All salaried "locally-engaged" employees in foreign countries are also reported on forms. See the Glossary for definition.

Non-Salaried Employees (Prevalling Rate, Shyps' Officers and Crews, Casuals and Others)
Statistics on non-salaried employees in departmental branches, services and corporations are collected, in all cases, by means of forms or statements. These sumary reports based on payroll and other records indicate the staff strength, regular earnings, retroactive payments and overtime payments. Casual "locally-engaged" employees are also reported by this means. The ships' officers, which are in fact salaried employees, are included in the non-salaried group owing to their special treatment under the financial Administration Act.

## Departmental Corporations

The Departmental Crown Corporations fall under Schedule B of the Financial Administration Act, see the Glossary for definitions. The following lists the Departmental Corporations included in the tables on Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations:

## Hirings and Separations of Salaried Employees

Data on hirings and separations of salaried employees was first published in the Federal Government Employment report for December 1959 and covered the quarter October 1 to December 31 , 1959. This table, included in the monthly report once each quarter, records hiring and separation numbers, averages and rates by department. "Department", as defined for use in hiring and separation statistics only, means a department, a departmental branch or departmental service which has a separately administered personnel office. For this reason organizations such as the Dominion Bureau of Statistics which are included under a departmental heading (Trade and Commerce) in the main tables are accorded separate departmental status in the table on staff turnover.

Each "department" is considered for purposes of turnover statistics as a separate employing agency. Consequently, movements of personnel between "departments" are treated in the same way as movements into and out of the government service. The aggregate hirings and separations are summed up in "Total - all Departments". It should be noted, therefore, that hiring and separation data for the entire Government of Canada as an employer cannot be secured from this table. The difference between this and the "Total - all Departments" would equal the number of inter-departmental movements which are, in fact, relatively few.

It should also be noted that the totals shown in this table differ from hiring and separation data published by the Civil Service Comisaion of Canada. The latter organization treats all staff employed under the authority of the Civil Service Act as a complete unit and consequently is concerned
only with movements into and out of "Act" employment. The Comission therefore is not concerned wite: inter-departmental movements of employees but on the other hand is concerned with movements of staff to and from "Act" employment even when such movements occur within a department.

The glossary of terms on page 40 should be referred to for definitions of certain terms used in the table on hirings and separations. These terms are:

## 1. Average employment

2. Monthly average (as pertains to hirings and separations)
3. Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (as pertains to hirings and separations).

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees. The numbers hired and separated as well as the average employment are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates.

## CLASSIFICATION BY FUNCTION

The statistics of departmental branches, services and corporations are classified in tables 6 and 7 by function. The purpose of providing a classification by function is to supply a means of studying the operations of goverments without the complications resulting from differences in administrative establishment which occur from time to time in each government and between governments. This analysis is useful in three ways. First it permits a detailed study of employment by the Government of Canada according to the main purposes or functions. Since these functions are not subject to the periodic changes which alter the administrative structure of the government, it is possible to develop a statistical series which, with minor exceptions, is consistent over an extended period of time. Second, since differences in administrative establishments are eliminsted, it is possible to make meaningful comparisons between federal government expenditures on employment and similar expenditu:es by other levels of goverment. Third, an analysis of the relationship between expenditures on employment and total expenditures can be made with regard to each function. The use of percentages will facilitate comparisons especially between levels of government.

The classification by function reflects the purpose served by the expenditure, and employment statistics presented on this basis have been classified in accordance with concepts evolved by the Public Finance Section of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the presentation of financial statistics. The following listing shows how the administrative detail has been applied to the various functions and will serve to indicate clearly the meaning of each function. Since "other" is actually a group of functions, the component parts have been listed separately so that each may be self-evident.

## COMPARABILITY BETWEEN NUMBERS AND EARNINGS

The user of these statistics is advised to avoid making direct comparisons between the numbers of employees reported and the earnings reported, the reason for this being that numbers relate to the last day of the month wherever possible and otherwise to the final pay period of the month. Since in certain categories, especially casual employment, considerable fluctuations in numbers employed frequently occur during a month, it will be seen that a comparison between the earnings of all persons employed during the month and the number on strength at the end of the month would, in many cases, not be valid.

## COMPARABILITY WITH PORMER SURVEY

The statistical series produced on an annual basis for the years 1925 to 1952 was intended to include the number of permanent and temporary employees in the general administrative government services (this broadly speaking, included those coming under the civil Service Act). In addition, the earnings of certain classes of employees referred to as "non-enumerated" classes were shown in the publication. The survey did not include a count of these "non-enumerated" classes. Since there was a distinct variation in the interpretation by departments of what constituted these groups there resulted differences between departments in the coverage of employees and earnings included in the annual series. The monthly series which commenced in April, 1952 includes employees not formerly counted in the tabulations as well as a number of government services not previously included, and consequently the statistics should not be compared with the former annual series.

## GLOSSARY OR PRINCIPAL TERMS USED

1. Department: Also known as departmental services, departments are the named divisions of the Government of Canada as defined in the Financial Administration Act. See also 14 and 15 for special cases.
2. Crown corporation: A corporation which is ultimately accountable, through a Minister to Parliament for the conduct of its affairs, and includes the corporations named in the Financial Administration Act in Schedule $B$ as departmental corporations, in Schedule $C$ as agency corporations and in Schedule D as proprietary corporations.
3. Departmental corporation: A Crown corporation which is a servant or agent of Her Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for administrative, supervisory, or regulstory services of a governmental nature.
4. Agency corporation: A crown corporation which is an agent of Her Majesty in right of Canada and is responsible for the management of trading or service operations on a quasi-commercial basis, or for the management of procurement, construction or disposal activities on behalf of Her Majesty in right of Cansda.
5. Proprietary corporation: A Crown corporation which (i) is responsible for the management of lending or financial operations, or for the management of comercial and industrial operations involving the production of or dealing in goods and the supplying of services to the public, and (2) is ordinarily required to conduct its operations without appropriations from the Federal Treasury.
6. Salaried employee: An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
7. Prevalling rate employee: A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, dally, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Prevailing Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board. The positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
8. Ships' officer: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certifled under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
9. Ships' crew employee: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and Royal Canadian Mounted Pollce. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act - Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimstes of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
10. Casual and other employees: All employees in Departments and Departmental corporations of the Government of Canada who are not defined as Salaried, Prevailing Rate, Ships' Officer or Ships' Crew employees.
11. Locally-Engaged employees: These are residents of foreign countries, employed by the Governaent of Canada to perform duties in the country in which they live. Their salary or wage is stated in the currency of the country where they are employed. Salaried locally-engaged employees occupy positions: (1) as Assistants; (2) in classes having the suffix U.K. 1.e., Clerk 2(UK), Stenographer 1 (UK), etc. While most are salaried, some are employed on a casual basis. The term "locallyengaged" excludes Canadian employees posted abroad.
12. Regular earnings: The basic pay of employees before deductions but excluding any special payments such as overtime, living allowances, etc. All regular earnings for the month, including those of persons off-strength at the end of the month are included in the tables where the title is used.
13. Earnings: As used in tables 1 \& 2 this term means gross earnings before deductions including overtime, retroactive pay and other special payments in addition to regular earnings. In table 1 , the earnings of employees of Departments and Departmental Corporations is limited to regular earnings plus overtime and retroactive pay.
14. Hiring: The initial appointment of a person to the reporting department whether as a new employee In the Govermment Service or by transfer from another department. Movements within a department are not considered as hirings. For purposes of hirings and separations only, the term "department" as used above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.
15. Separations: The teraination of service of an employee in the reporting department by leaving the Covernment Service or by transfer to another department. Movements within a department are not cunsidered as separations. For purposes of birings and separations only, the term "department" as ased above is broadened to include departmental branches or services having a separately adminis~ tered personnel office.
16. Average employment: As used in the table on hiringland separtions represents the mean monthly average number of employees in each "department" during the quarter.
17. Monthly average (as pertains to hirings and separations): represeatis the arithmetic mean i.e. one third of the actual hirings and separations for the quarter.
18. Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (as pertains to hirings and separations): the rate is computed by the following formula:
monthly average (number hired or separated) $x 1,000$
average employment (during quarter)
