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

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Estimates of Labour Income

November 1958

The preliminary labour income estimate for November of \$1,385.5 million is \$4.3 million or 0.3% lower than the revised October figure (\$1,389.3 million). This decline is attributable mainly to the effects of usual seasonal influences. The seasonally adjusted total of \$1,365.9 million showed an increase of \$11.0 million (0.8%) over the \$1,354.9 million total estimated for the previous month. All industries, with the exception of agriculture, mining, and part of the service group, contributed to the rise in the seasonally adjusted total.

A comparison with the November 1957 total reveals an increase over the twelve-month period of \$40.9 million or 3.0%. Average weekly wages and salaries in the "industrial composite" group increased by 3.3% (\$71.55 as compared with \$69.24) over the same period.

Regions

Labour income was up from last month in Quebec and Ontario but declined in the Atlantic and Prairie provinces and in British Columbia. Normal seasonal influences were operative in all areas, but their effects were less conspicuous in Quebec and Ontario than in the other provinces.

All provinces contributed to the October-November increase in the seasonally adjusted series, a situation which has not taken place since last February. Ontario advanced by almost one per cent in contrast to the downward movement from September to October.

November marked the second successive month in which all area estimates were higher than a year ago. In percentage terms the November-to-November increase was appreciably higher than the October-to-October increase.

Manufacturing

Ontario was the only region in which the manufacturing wage-bill advanced from October to November but the rise in this province was of sufficient magnitude to induce a small increase in the Canada total. The settlement of some important industrial disputes was partly responsible for this increase.

The seasonally adjusted estimates also indicate a substantial gain in Ontario with the remaining areas displaying little or no change from the preceding month.

The pattern of year-to-year change in manufacturing was unchanged from the previous month, with the Atlantic Region, Quebec and Ontario down from last year and the Prairie Region and British Columbia up.




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NOTES ON THE ESTIMATES OF LABOUR INCOME

Labour income is defined as the total of wages, salaries, and supplementary labour payments made to, or on behalf of, residents of Canada, excluding military pay and allowances. The wages and salaries component, which is specified to include living allowances, bonuses, commissions, and "tips", is measured prior to deductions of all kinds (income tax, employees' contributions to the Unemployment Insurance Fund and to welfare and pension funds, etc.). Both money payments and payments in kind are included in the total. The other component, supplementary labour income, comprises payments made by employers on behalf of their employees in order to provide them with future benefits, either definite or contingent. Specifically, these payments include employers' contributions to employee welfare and pension funds, to workmen's compensation and industrial vacation funds, and to the Unemployment Insurance Fund.

The annual estimates of labour income are based in most cases on survey data collected by D.B.S., published accounting records, or information otherwise obtained directly from business or government agencies. In a few cases information is not available for non-census years and projections from census "benchmarks" are made using the best available related indicators. Persons interested in descriptions of sources and methods and of the relationship between labour income and the national accounts are referred to the D.B.S. publication National Accounts, Income and Expenditure: 1926-1956. A separate reference paper dealing with labour income will be released in the near future and will provide additional detailed information of this kind. It will include annual estimates dating from 1926 and monthly or quarterly series from 1947.

The monthly and quarterly income estimates are obtained by applying indicators of short-run change to the estimated annual totals. About four-fifths of aggregate labour income is estimated on the basis of payroll indexes obtained from a monthly survey of establishments normally employing fifteen or more persons (see the D.B.S. monthly publication Employment and Payrolls). For industries not covered by this survey the estimates are based on indexes which are either derived from other sources of payroll information or specially constructed on the basis of related data. A constant number of working days is assumed for each month in order to avoid the effects of differences in numbers of holidays and week-ends.

The most recent monthly or quarterly figures are preliminary and subject to revision in the next issue. In addition, figures for the most recent years are subject to further minor revisions as new annual source materials become available.

The monthly and quarterly figures in this report are presented with one digit after the decimal point, i.e. to the nearest tenth of a million dollars. This is done in order to avoid sudden changes in estimates for small provinces or industries which would occur if the figures were rounded to the nearest million, and it should not be assumed that the estimates are accurate to the nearest tenth of a million.

FOOTNOTES
