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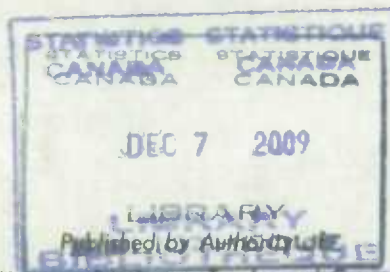

## GLOSSARY OF PRINCIPAL TERMS USED

DEPARTMENTAL SERVICES: Also known as General Fund activities. This comprises the activities carried on by provincial governments as reflected in their Estimates and in addition, expenditures on employment by special or administrative funds.

PROVINCIAL INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION: These are educational institutions at the university level which are under the control of the provincial government, but which are not administered under departmental authority.

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT ENTERPRISES: These produce goods and services for sale to governments or to others, making a direct charge for goods and services.

SALARY EARNERS: Employees in receipt of a salary based on monthly or annual rates of pay. These employees may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional or part-time nature.

WAGE EARNERS: Employees in receipt of a wage based on hourly, daily or weekly rates of pay.

FULL-TIME WAGE EARNERS: Employees who occupy a continuing full-time position.

OTHER WAGE EARNERS: Employees who do not occupy a continuing full-time position. Examples are: seasonal, part-time and casual wage earners.

NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES: Represents the number of persons on the payroll for the last pay period reported in each month.

GROSS PAYROLLS: Payrolls reported are the gross payrolls of all persons paid for work done during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. They include retroactive pay, salary adjustments and over-time payments.

Data of the Departmental Services, Government Enterprises and Workmen's Compensation Board of the Province of British Columbia are not available for inclusion in this publication. Data for the Institutions of Higher Education in that Province are included.

The number of employees relates to employment on the last day of the month or at the end of the final pay period of the month. The payrolls represent all monies paid to employees during the period before any deductions for income tax etc. Retroactive and overtime payments are included in the month the payments are made.

The cumulative gross payrolls (excluding the Province of British Columbia as noted above) reported for the second quarter 1970, amounted to \$581.2 million, an increase of 4.4 per cent over the \$556.5 million reported for the first quarter of 1970 and 12.3 per cent over the \$517.6 million reported for the April 1 - June 30, quarter of 1969. The number of employees reported for the last pay period of June 1970 was 358,015 an increase of 7.5 per cent over the 333,161 reported for the same period in March 1970 and a 1.6 per cent increase over the 352,285 reported for the last pay period in June 1969. These increases are the result of: 1. The normal seasonal activities within the following functions "Transportation and Communications" "Recreational and Cultural Services" "Natural Resources and Primary Industries". 2. The payment of retroactive salary and wage increases, and the effects of these increases in the cost of government services.

Due to unavoidable delays in the reporting of monthly data, estimates have been made for some departments for the month of June 1970. Revised totals will be published in the next quarterly report.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

APRIL - JUNE 1970

### General

This report contains statistics of employment and payrolls for nine provincial governments and the Yukon and Northwest Territories. Information on departmental services and provincial enterprises for British Columbia are not available at the present time. The first published quarterly report in this series was for October 1 - December 31, 1959.

The purpose of this survey of provincial government employment is to: (1) provide statistics relative to national labour force and national accounts income and expenditure series, (2) provide governments with figures which will serve their needs for statistical measurements of employment, (3) make such data available to research groups, students and the general public.

An analysis of departmental or "general fund" services is given by purpose or "function". This analysis is useful in three ways. First, it permits a detailed study of the employment in each province according to major functions or purposes. Since these functions are not altered by changes in administrative structure which occur from time to time they permit the development of a series which is consistent, with minor changes, over an extended period. Second, since differences in administrative establishment do not seriously affect a function classification it is possible to measure employment in comparable terms between provinces as well as between the various levels of government. Third, this classification permits analysis for each function, of the relationship between expenditures on employment and total expenditures.

### Coverage

Data in the report consist of four major groups.

1. DEPARTMENTAL SERVICES: In this publication "General Fund" activities are shown under the heading "Departmental Services". This comprises the activities carried on by provincial governments as reflected in their Estimates and, in addition, expenditures on employment by special or administrative funds. For a more complete explanation of "General Fund" refer to the annual report published by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics entitled "Provincial Government Finance" (Publication No. 68-207).
2. PROVINCIAL INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION: These are educational institutions at the university level which are under the control of the provincial government but which are not administered under departmental authority. It will be noted, therefore, that this group does not include certain institutions that are considered in some degree to be provincial institutions of higher education, such as Teachers' Colleges, Agricultural and Vocational Colleges, and others. The latter are included in group one, "Departmental Services".

On the other hand, figures given for "Provincial Institutions of Higher Education" include employment figures for subsidiary organizations that are not recognized as being educational in nature. For example, University of Toronto includes Connaught Medical Research Laboratories.

4. WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION BOARDS: Separate data from the Workmen's Compensation Board of each province (for which data is available) is shown. Prior to April 1962 this data was included with "Provincial Government Enterprises".





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### SALARY EARNERS AND WAGE EARNERS

Employees included in these statistics are treated as either Salary Earners or Wage Earners. Salary Earners include all those employees whose remuneration is based on an annual rate. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, sessional or part time nature. Wage Earners are divided into two groups: 1) Wage Earners-Full-Time: These are hourly, daily or weekly rated staff who are employed throughout the year on a full-time basis. 2) Other Wage Earners: These are wage-earning employees who are NOT employed on a full-time year round basis. Examples are seasonal, part-time and casual wage earners.

Employment and payrolls are reported monthly and in general are divided between Salary Earners and Wage Earners according to their basis of remuneration. The Gross Payrolls represent all monies paid to employees during the month, before any deductions for income tax, etc. For employees paid on a weekly or fortnightly basis the amount paid during all pay periods ending in the month is included. Retroactive and overtime payments are included in the month the payments are made. The numbers of employees relate to employment on the last day of the month or at the end of the final pay period of the month.

Salary earners include those public officials who are appointed for a term of one year or more, such as judges and other court officers paid by the province. Certain justices and judges within the provinces are appointed by the Government of Canada which pays most of their stipend. Since the numbers and Federal payments to these persons are referred to in the "Federal Government Employment" report they have not been included in this report. Any salaries or allowances paid by the Provincial Government, however, have been included and footnoted in the "Provincial Government Employment" report.

### COMPARABILITY BETWEEN NUMBERS AND EARNINGS

The user of these statistics is advised to avoid making direct comparison between the numbers of employees reported and the payrolls reported, the reason for this being that numbers relate to the last day of the month wherever possible and otherwise to the final pay period of the month. Since in certain categories, especially casual employment, considerable fluctuations in numbers employed occur during a month it will be seen that a comparison between the payrolls of all persons employed during the month and the number on strength at the end of the month would, in many cases, not be valid.
