PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

October-December, 1960

This Report is a companion series to that dealing with "Federal Employment" which presents details of employment and payrolls of the Government of Canada. The two series give details of federal and provincial government employment and will ultimately be supplemented by a third series covering the municipal government field.

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for July-September, 1960.

A major change in the definition of employees was adopted in October, 1960. Employees included in these statistics are now divided into two main groups, namely: SALARY EARNERS and WAGE EARNERS. Salary Earners are employees who are in receipt of a salary based on monthly or annual rates. Wage Earners, on the other hand, are those employees who are in receipt of a wage based on hourly, daily or weekly rates.


For the purpose of this report, Salary Earners include all salaried staff whether employed on a full-time or a part-time basis. Wage Earners are divided into two groups: 1) Wage Earners - Full Time: These are wage earners who are employed throughout the year on a full-time basis. 2) Other Wage Earners: These are wage-earning employees who are not employed on a full-time year-round basis. Examples are seasonal, part-time and casual wage earners.

In the accompanying tables, the significant features of provincial government employment within each of the provinces supplying these statistics have been recorded. The information for departmental services and government enterprises of the provinces of Quebec and British Columbia is not available at the present time.

Employment and earnings have been reported for each pay period and, in general, are divided between "salary earners" and "wage earners" according to the continuity of employment. The rule followed, where several pay periods occur during the month, is to take the number of individuals reported for the final pay period and the total amount paid to all persons employed during the month. Thus no comparison between numbers and earnings should be made for the purpose of obtaining average earnings, especially in the case of "wage earners" where the numbers on strength may vary substantially within a single month.

Salary earners include those public officials who are appointed for a term of one year or more, such as judges and other court officers paid by the province. Certain justices and judges within the provinces are appointed by the Government of Canada which pays most of their stipend. Since the numbers and Federal payments to these persons are footnoted in the "Federal Government Employment" report they have not been included in this report. Any salaries or allowances paid by the Provincial Government, however, have been included and footnoted in the "Provincial Government Employment" report.

Four new tables have been presented in this report. Table 1 combines all employees reported for the months December 1960, September 1960 and December 1959. Table 2 combines gross earnings for the quarters October 1 - December 31, 1960; July 1 - September 30, 1960; October 1 - December 31, 1959 and for the year January 1 - December 31, 1960. Tables 3 and 4 are comparative tables for employees and gross earnings for the fourth quarter 1960 and 1959.
