

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

January - March, 1961

These statistics form a companion series to that dealing with "Federal Employment" which presents details of employment and payrolls of the Government of Canada. The two give details of federal and provincial government employment and will ultimately be supplemented by a third series covering the municipal government field.

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this report was given, together with other background detail, in the issue for July - September, 1960. Certain important changes in definition of employees were explained in the report for October - December, 1960.

In the accompanying tables, the significant features of provincial government employment within each of the provinces supplying these statistics have been recorded. The information for departmental services and government enterprises of the provinces of Quebec and British Columbia is not available at the present time.

Employment and earnings have been reported for each pay period and, in general, are divided between "salary earners" and "wage earners" according to the continuity of employment. The rule followed, where several pay periods occur during the month, is to take the number of individuals reported for the final pay period and the total amount paid to all persons employed during the month. Thus no comparison between numbers and earnings should be made for the purpose of obtaining average earnings, especially in the case of "wage earners" where the numbers on strength may vary substantially within a single month.

Salary earners include those public officials who are appointed for a term of one year or more, such as judges and other court officers paid by the province. Certain justices and judges within the provinces are appointed by the Government of Canada which pays most of their stipend. Since the numbers and Federal payments to these persons are footnoted in the "Federal Government Employment" report they have not been included in this report. Any salaries or allowances paid by the Provincial Government, however, have been included and footnoted in the "Provincial Government Employment" report.

A review of totals shows that employees and gross earnings were considerably lower in the quarter ended March 31, 1961 than in the October - December, 1960 period. This resulted mainly from reduced activity in services which normally employ large numbers of part-time or seasonal wage earners. Highways departments, for example, normally employ numerous persons for sanding, salting and snow removal. Unusually light snowfall especially during January and February of this year caused a greatly lower than normal demand for such employees. Highways departments are included in the Function "Transportation and Communications" Reference to tables 11 and 12 shows that employment of wage earners in that Function dropped from 17,957 in the October - December quarter to 12,283 in the January - March period while earnings of these employees declined from \$9,586,000 to \$7,377,000.

Employment and payroll statistics for the Government of the Yukon Territory will be included for the first time in the April - June, 1961 report.
