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

GLOSSARY OF PRINCIPAL TERMS USED

DEPARTMENTAL SERVICES: Also known as General Fund activities. This comprehends the activities carried on by provincial governments as reflected in their Estimates and in addition, expenditures on employment by special or administrative funds.

PROVINCIAL INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION: These are educational institutions at the university level which are under the control of the provincial government, but which are not administered under departmental authority.

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT ENTERPRISES: These produce goods and services for sale to governments or to others, making a direct charge for goods and services.

SALARY EARNERS: Employees in receipt of a salary based on monthly or annual rates of pay. These employees may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional or part-time nature.

WAGE EARNERS: Employees in receipt of a wage based on hourly, daily or weekly rates of pay.

FULL-TIME WAGE EARNERS: Employees who occupy a continuing full-time position.

OTHER WAGE EARNERS: Employees who do not occupy a continuing full-time position. Examples are: seasonal, part-time and casual wage earners.

NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES: Represents the number of persons on the payroll for the last pay period reported in each month.

GROSS PAYROLLS: Payrolls reported are the gross payrolls of all persons paid for work done during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. They include retroactive pay, salary adjustments and over-time payments.

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April - June 1967

Data of the Departmental Services, Government Enterprises and Workmen's Compensation Board of the Province of British Columbia are not available for inclusion in this publication. Data for the Institutions of Higher Education are included.

Prior to January 1, 1967, regular employees of the Province of Ontario were paid 5 days in advance, i.e. a month end cheque was issued on the 24th or 25th of the month. Effective April 1, 1968 employees will be paid 9 days in arrears and Bi-weekly, to prepare for this, it has been necessary for the departments to gradually change pay days each month during the current year. This has resulted in some departments having only one pay day in August and others one pay day in September, and marked reduction in the monthly ~~earnings~~ reported. (see footnote on table 3.)

PAYROLLS

The gross payrolls of the provincial government employees (available for inclusion in this report) for the period July 1 - September 30, 1967 amounted to \$424.7 million an increase of 7.9 per cent over the \$393.6 million reported for the previous quarter of April - June 1967 and a 15.9 per cent increase over the \$366.5 million reported for the same period in 1966.

The number of employees reported for the last pay period in September 1967 was 326,365 an increase of 3.8 per cent from the 314,297 reported for the same pay period in June 1967 and a 10.3 per cent increase over the 295,831 employees reported for September 1966.

These increases are the result of normal seasonal increases in the "Transportation and Communication", "Health and Social Welfare", "Recreational and Cultural Services" (PARKS), "Natural Resources and Primary Industries", (FORESTS) functions.

The 210,816 employees reported by the Departmental Services for the last pay period of September 1967 represents a 3.6 per cent increase over the 203,515 employees reported for the same period in the month of June. The payrolls for the quarterly period July 1 - September 30, 1967 amounted to \$246.1 million a 3.8 per cent increase over the \$237.2 million reported for the April 1 - June 30, 1967 period. The total payroll for the July - September quarter was affected by a change in the pay days for the Province of Ontario.

Total payrolls of provincial employees reported for the period January 1 - September 30, 1967 amounted to \$1,179.7 million. Employees in Departmental Services earned \$699.7 million or 59.3 per cent of the total while the staff of the Institutions of Higher Education received \$130.5 million or 11.1 per cent. The employees of Provincial Government Enterprises earned \$335.2 million or 28.4 per cent and the staff of the Workmen's Compensation Boards received \$14.3 million or 1.2 per cent.

Due to unavoidable delays in the reporting of monthly data, estimates have been used for some departments for the month of September. Revised totals will be published in the next quarterly report.
