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

COMMENTARY

In 1962, industrial employment as measured by the industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) averaged substantially higher than in 1961. The advance between 1961 and 1962 of 2.8 p.c. raised average employment to 121.4 and marked the strongest year-to-year rise since that from 1955 to 1956. However, the gains during 1962 were not enough to carry average employment levels above the record high of 122.6 recorded in 1957. Most major industrial divisions contributed to the overall increase, with employment in manufacturing, in finance, insurance and real estate and in service recording the largest percentage gains. All provinces reported higher average levels of employment except New Brunswick which showed no change. Percentage increases were greater than the national average in Prince Edward Island, Ontario and British Columbia.

The proportion of women employed rose in 1962. The industrial composite index of employment for females was up 3.5 p.c. from 1961 to 128.5 while that for males was up 2.7 p.c. to 119.4.

The rise in the industrial composite annual averages reflected increases in the seasonally-adjusted monthly indexes which began early in 1961. By the end of 1962 the seasonally-adjusted index, at 122.4, was up 5.0 p.c. from the March 1961 low of 116.6.

The industrial composite annual average of weekly wages and salaries rose by 3.1 p.c. over the year to \$80.55 for 1962. All major industrial divisions recorded percentage increases approximating that for the composite, except forestry and construction which rose by 5.7 p.c. and 4.0 p.c. respectively. The annual average index for payrolls, at 229.8, was up 6.1 p.c. from the 1961 figure.

Employment, 1961 - to - 1962 Averages

Manufacturing

Over half the increase in the composite reflected gains in manufacturing where average employment rose by 4.0 p.c. to 113.3 in 1962. Year-to-year increases were recorded in both durable and non-durable goods manufacturing with the former component accounting for about two-thirds of the advance. Average employment in durables rose by 5.8 p.c. to 117.0 in 1962, considerably below the post-war high of 126.4 recorded in 1956. Employment in non-durable goods manufacturing rose by 2.5 p.c. to a record high of 110.2.

The advance in durable goods manufacturing was due to marked improvement in all component industry groups, except non-ferrous metals which showed a small increase. The rise in wood products was below the average for the division although an advance of 5.8 p.c. was recorded in furniture prod-

ucts. Iron and steel rose by 6.1 p.c. over the year to 109.2 as all component industries strengthened except agricultural implements. Employment in transportation equipment was up 5.8 p.c. from 1961 reversing the downward trend apparent since 1957. The increase from 1961 to 1962 was due to a marked upsurge in the motor vehicle and parts industries and in shipbuilding and repairing. Electrical apparatus and supplies recorded the largest percentage increase over the year, rising by 11.4 p.c. to 148.1, partly owing to a strong advance in telecommunication equipment. Accelerated growth in the concrete industry accounted for the expansion in non-metallic mineral products.

Employment in non-durable goods manufacturing rose by 2.5 p.c. over the year; all component industry groups reported higher average levels of employment. Food and beverages was up by 1.8 p.c. as employment expanded in the fish, fruit and vegetable processing industries. There were increases of 4 p.c. or more in tobacco, rubber, textiles and in miscellaneous manufacturing. Expansion in synthetic textiles and silk advanced employment levels in textile products. Moderate increases of 2.4 p.c. and 1.8 p.c. in the relatively large clothing and paper products industries accounted for a quarter of the rise in non-durables.

Non-Manufacturing Industries

Construction was the only goods-producing industrial division other than manufacturing for which the 1962 index was higher than the figures for 1961. The construction index showed a moderate rise of 2.1 p.c. Average employment levels rose in all the service-producing industrial divisions except transportation, storage and communication which has shown year-to-year decreases for five successive years. Percentage increases of 4.3 and 5.1 were recorded in finance, insurance and real estate and in service. A much smaller but equally significant percentage increase of 2.0 p.c. was reported in trade where the numbers employed (by firms covered in this survey) are greater than in finance, insurance and real estate and in service.

Provinces and Regions

All provinces reported higher average levels of employment except New Brunswick which showed no change. Percentage gains were greater than the national average (2.8 p.c.) in Prince Edward Island, Ontario, and British Columbia.

Except in Prince Edward Island, there was little change in average employment levels for the provinces comprising the Atlantic Region. The regional index for 1962, at 105.1, was only 0.6 p.c. above that for 1961. For the region as a whole, there were substantial percentage increases in manufacturing, in finance, insurance and real estate and in

service. In manufacturing, these gains reflected strong advances in food processing and in shipbuilding and repairing. However, the increases were largely offset by reductions in forestry, in mining, in construction and in transportation, storage and communication.

In Quebec, the index rose from 118.3 in 1961 to 121.6 in 1962. All industrial divisions made some advance over 1961 except forestry. However, manufacturing did not advance as much in Quebec as in Canada as a whole. Only wood products, iron and steel products and electrical apparatus and supplies reported substantially higher average employment in 1962, whereas some large industry groups such as paper products and transportation equipment showed virtually no change. In the last-named industry group, a marked advance in shipbuilding and repairing was largely offset by declines in aircraft and parts and railroad and rolling stock equipment.

Employment in Ontario was up 3.6 p.c. from 1961 to 123.0 as employment expanded strongly in manufacturing. In this division, all industry groups in the durables component reported advances of 5.0 p.c. or more, except non-ferrous metals which showed a small decline. In iron and steel products, there were substantial gains in iron castings, machinery, primary iron and steel and sheet metal products. In transportation equipment all industries were up over the year but the most significant advances were in the motor vehicle and parts industries. In the non-durables component, rubber and textile products recorded the largest percentage increases.

In the Prairie Region, employment rose by 1.8 p.c. to 131.2 over the year as all industrial divisions advanced except transportation, storage and communication. The largest gain was 5.9 p.c. in finance, insurance and real estate. The increase of 1.8 p.c. in manufacturing was considerably below that for Canada as a whole.

Average employment levels in British Columbia rose by 3.0 p.c. to 115.7 in 1962. All major industrial divisions except public utility operations advanced. Increases of over 7.0 p.c. were recorded in forestry and mining. British Columbia was the only region reporting a significant rise in mining. Manufacturing rose by 3.7 p.c. as increases of 10.7 p.c. and 14.1 p.c. were reported in iron and steel products and transportation equipment respectively; the gains in the latter industry reflected a marked advance in shipbuilding and repairing.

Employment by Sex

The proportion of women in industrial employment increased slightly in 1962. The industrial composite index of employment for women was up 3.5 p.c. from 1961 to 128.6 while that for men was up 2.6 p.c. to 119.3. Almost half the increase in the number of women employed occurred in manufacturing. In that division the index for women employed in 1962 was 109.1, up 4.9 p.c. from the 1961 figure.

The index for men rose by 3.8 p.c. to 114.6. As a result, the proportion of women employed advanced slightly from 22.9 p.c. to 23.1 p.c.

A two-fold development contributed to the relative increase in the proportion of women employed in 1962. First, in some industrial divisions the year-to-year percentage rise in the numbers of women employed exceeded that for men as was the case in manufacturing. Secondly, among industries showing large year-to-year percentage increases were several that employed high proportions of women. This was true for some industries within manufacturing as well as for finance, insurance and real estate and service. Within manufacturing, electrical apparatus and supplies was outstanding in this respect. This industry, where women comprise about 30 p.c. of the employees recorded gains of over 11.0 p.c. in the year.

Cyclical Trends in Employment 1960-62

Trends in Major Industrial Divisions and the Industrial Composite

During 1962, there was a continuation of the upward movement in the seasonally-adjusted industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) that began early in 1961. The rate of increase in the latter part of 1962 was not as great as in the preceding twelve months.

The 1961-62 period of increases followed a period of declines, in which the seasonally-adjusted composite index decreased from 120.6 (in October 1959) to 116.6 (in March 1961), a reduction of 3.3 p.c. Over three-quarters of the loss was regained in 1961, with the adjusted index rising to 120.0 in December of that year. The index rose above the October 1959 cyclical peak level early in 1962, and continued to gain through the rest of the year. The December figure was 122.4, about 1.0 p.c. below the all-time peak in the adjusted composite index reached in the early months of 1957.

The goods-producing industries are, in general, more sensitive to cyclical factors than the service-producing industries, and most of the 1959-1961 decrease occurred in the goods-producing sector. Reductions of 6 p.c. or more were recorded for each industry in the group except non-durable goods manufacturing where the decline was less than 1 p.c. Typically, non-durables is less affected by recessionary influences because it consists largely of industries producing consumer goods for immediate consumption. In the service-producing divisions, transportation, storage and communication and public utility operation declined, the reduction in the former being over 4.0 p.c. Employment in trade was almost unchanged throughout the recession. Service and finance, insurance and real estate continued to advance.

During the strong recovery in 1961, from March to December, employment rose substantially in all the goods-producing industrial divisions. The most

significant advance was in durable-goods manufacturing in which the adjusted index rose by 5.0 p.c. Although non-durables is usually relatively insensitive to cyclical swings in employment, from March 1961 to the end of the year the division rose by 2.7 p.c. There were advances in all service-producing industrial divisions except transportation, storage and communication. The largest percentage increase was in service which rose by 5.9 p.c.

In 1962, durable-goods manufacturing continued to rise as rapidly as in 1961. Non-durables advanced at its 1961 rate until about June 1962 but then levelled. Forestry, mining and construction weakened in 1962 although the last two named indicated some strengthening in the first half of the year. In the service-producing divisions, public utility operation and service rose at a reduced rate. For service, the change from December 1961 to December 1962 was 3.3 p.c. as against a rise of 6.8 p.c. from December 1960 to December 1961.

Between October 1959 and March 1961 the employment index for the manufacturing division declined from 112.1 to 107.3. The reduction reflected a fall of about 8.0 p.c. in the durables component. During the remainder of 1961 most of the loss was recovered as employment in non-durables showed strength. Over the first half of 1962 both components continued to record marked increases with the pace in non-durables slackening somewhat. As a result, by July 1962 the manufacturing index stood at 113.6, considerably above the October 1959 peak of 112.1. Over the last half of the year manufacturing continued at a reduced rate largely as a result of weakening in the non-durables component.

Durable-Goods Manufacturing

All industry groups in durable-goods manufacturing declined between the fall of 1959 and the spring of 1961 with decreases in iron and steel and transportation equipment accounting for almost two-thirds of the overall reduction. Between March and December 1961, all the groups except non-ferrous metal products showed improvement, with the largest percentage increases being recorded in electrical apparatus and supplies and non-metallic mineral products.

During 1962, the trends apparent in 1961 were maintained. Electrical apparatus and supplies and non-metallic mineral products continued to advance strongly and by the end of the year had surpassed the peak levels of 1959. Of more significance because of the numbers employed therein, was the continued improvement in transportation equipment and the accelerated growth in iron and steel products. Non-ferrous metals showed mild improvement through most of 1962 but weakened after August.

Iron and Steel Products.—All components of iron and steel products declined sharply between October 1959 and March 1961. Some industries continued to weaken even after the cyclical low was reached in March 1961; agricultural implements,

fabricated and structural steel and sheet metal products were the most notable of these. There was immediate improvement in primary iron and steel, iron castings and heating and cooking appliances, while machinery products began to pick up about the middle of 1961. During the first half of 1962 all industry groups except agricultural implements rose substantially; in the second half some of these trends were reversed. Fabricated and structural steel, sheet metal products and iron castings slackened while there was expansion in agricultural implements and machinery.

Transportation Equipment.—In transportation equipment, all component industries except aircraft and parts declined between October 1959 and March 1961. The situation in aircraft and parts was unsettled because of the heavy layoffs in the industry in the first quarter of 1959. During 1961, all components made some advance although the improvement in the motor vehicle and parts industries and in shipbuilding and repairing was the most marked. These same industries continued to record substantial gains throughout 1962. However, 1962 saw a contraction in the aircraft and parts industry.

Non-Durable Goods Manufacturing

Most components of non-durable goods manufacturing levelled during the recession of 1959-1961. Only rubber, textiles and clothing showed significantly reduced levels of employment. Most industrial groups strengthened during the last half of 1961 and the first six months of 1962. A notable exception was paper products which showed little change in 1961 although it advanced rather strongly through most of 1962. Apart from paper products, only rubber products and miscellaneous manufacturing industries continued to expand over the last half of 1962. The apparent weakening in chemical products reflected an industrial dispute which began in August and continued to affect the industry at the year's end.

Non-Manufacturing Industries

Goods-Producing Industrial Divisions.—As already mentioned, forestry, mining and construction declined sharply during the recession and in no case has employment risen above levels reached in the second half of 1959. In forestry and mining, this was partly a result of long-term trends towards reduced levels of employment in particular areas or segments within the divisions. The advance in construction in 1961 and its decline in 1962 reflected almost entirely the movement of the building and general engineering component.

The overall decline in the mining index was due mainly, to reductions in metals and fuels; non-metal mining has been a source of strength. In 1962, there was a mild recovery in metal mining until about the middle of the year but after that time the index fell sharply. In recent years, frequent periodic layoffs in coal mining has further depressed the total mining index and accounts largely for its erratic movement. Non-metal mining, on the other

hand, started to improve in 1960 and since then has moved steadily upwards although there was some slackening in the last half of 1962.

Service-Producing Industrial Divisions. — Between October 1959 and March 1961, transportation, storage and communication was the only service-producing division which recorded a marked decline. Since early 1961, the adjusted employment index for the division has fluctuated between 108.0 and 109.0, except for a few months in 1962 which were distorted by a major industrial dispute in the trucking industry. All major components of the division contributed to the decline but reductions in the transportation group were the most important. During the recovery, the transportation group rose slightly in 1961 but levelled in 1962. Storage steadily weakened through 1961 and the first half of 1962 but indicated some strengthening in the second half of 1962. Employment in communication did not turn upward until early in 1962 but rose strongly over the remainder of the year.

In transportation, most industry groups weakened between 1959 and 1961 but a reduction in railway employment was the main factor in the overall decline. Employment in railways has decreased since 1956 due to factors of a long-term nature. Water transportation, which has declined for several years, indicated some reversal of this trend in 1962. The upward trend in truck transportation was arrest-

ed in 1960 but began again in 1961; however, some levelling was indicated towards the end of 1962. Air transport and airports rose steadily throughout the recession and period following.

Average Weekly Wages and Salaries

The industrial composite annual average of weekly wages and salaries rose by 3.1 p.c. to \$80.55 in 1962. The latest percentage change was virtually the same as that for 1960 to 1961 and 1959 to 1960. In general the percentage increases for the major industrial divisions differed little from that for Canada. Exceptions were forestry and construction which showed percentage increases of 5.7 p.c. and 4.0 p.c., respectively. Increases in average earnings and employment in the relatively high-pay British Columbia forestry industry combined with reduced levels of employment in the industry in the Atlantic Region and Quebec contributed to the rise in earnings.

No province reported a percentage increase in per-capita earnings substantially higher than that for Canada as a whole. The percentage increases ranged from 1.9 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 3.8 in Saskatchewan. Regionally, the variations in size of increase were small, ranging from 2.6 p.c. in the Prairie Region to 3.5 p.c. in Quebec.

1949 = 100






1949 = 100




BY INDUSTRIAL DIVISION



INDUSTRIAL COMPOSITE











NOTES

General. — The monthly surveys of employment and weekly payrolls relate to all branches of the following industrial divisions: forestry, mining, manufacturing, transportation, storage and communication, construction, public utility, trade, finance, insurance and real estate, and to certain groups of the service industry, mainly hotels, restaurants, laundries and dry cleaning plants, recreational and business services. The surveys do not cover firms usually employing less than 15 persons, of which the number is very large in relation to their employment totals. Establishments reducing their staffs below this minimum are not necessarily removed from the mailing list. Data are requested for all classes of employees, irrespective of their functions in the business; statistics for the owners are excluded. Employers operating in two or more lines of business, or in different provinces or cities, are asked to furnish separate monthly returns for their establishments in the different units.

1. Coverage. — Virtual limitation of the surveys to firms with staffs of 15 and over results in a large and relatively even coverage of total employment in the included industries in most of the provinces and in the urban areas. The industrial representation, though large, is more uneven, the proportion of employees covered depending upon the organization of particular industries in larger or smaller units of operation. Complete information respecting the area and industry distributions of the working population is available only when the Decennial Censuses are taken, at place of residence. In 1951, data were not segregated for paid workers actually at work. Estimates of coverage that can be made are therefore conservative because they relate employees of reporting firms to all paid workers with jobs, including those absent from work without pay who would not be included in the monthly statistics of employment and payrolls. Estimates of coverage according to industrial divisions for Canada and the provinces are given in the first columns of Tables 3 and 4 of the monthly reports "Employment and Payrolls".

The following table contains provincial estimates of coverage of total wage-earners and salaried employees in all industries, including those in agriculture, government, education, health and other classes excluded from the monthly surveys, as well as paid workers in the industries that are included. The general estimate for Canada was 62 p.c.

It is important to note that the statistics of employees covered, as published in the monthly and annual reports, do not represent estimates of total numbers of paid workers in specified areas or industries, but show only the distributions of men and women on the staffs of the co-operating employers in the indicated periods, including their full-time, part-time and casual employees.

2. The Questionnaire used in the monthly surveys asks employers to state the number of wage-earners and salaried employees drawing pay in the last pay periods in the months, with their payroll disbursements in the same periods. The request for statistics for the last pay period in the month only is designed to prevent duplication in the employment count where individuals may appear on the payrolls of more than one employer in a period of several weeks. The workers reported are not necessarily employed for a period of a week, by any one establishment or by more than one. Workers on strike during the reported pay periods are not included in the statistics unless they draw pay from their employer; for example, take paid holidays during the dispute. Workers laid off without pay during the pay period as an indirect effect of industrial disputes are not counted as employed.

Employees and earnings are grouped according to the duration of their pay periods—monthly, semi-monthly, fortnightly, weekly, etc. Gross payrolls are requested before deductions are made for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Overtime payments, cost-of-living allowances, commissions, incentive and production bonuses are included, as are payments for absences with pay in the reported pay periods. The statistics do not include employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation and other welfare plans, nor do they include amounts paid for pensions, retirement gratuities, bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, and various other supplementary labour costs.

3. The Processing. — Statistics of wages and salaries reported for any period exceeding a week are reduced for tabulation purposes to one week's proportion of the totals, the numerators of the fractions used for this purpose being 5, 6 or 7 days, depending upon the number of days per week

on which the establishment operated in the pay period, the denominators of the fractions are the numbers of working days in the different pay periods. For employees paid at annual or monthly rates, whose earnings are not affected by variations in the number of working days in the month, fixed proportions are used to reduce the earnings to a weekly basis, irrespective of the length of the calendar month. The sums resulting from these various calculations are then aggregated to give the total amounts which would be paid for services rendered in one week by the employees of the co-operating firms.

4. The Tabulation.—Data tabulated each month show the numbers of women and of workers of both sexes drawing pay from the establishments furnishing returns and their weekly payrolls, with similar information for employees of the same firms a month earlier, and in the base period (1949). The statistics first published for each month are preliminary; re-tabulation of the data on the succeeding month's tabulation permits incorporation of revisions in the material originally tabulated and inclusion of returns received too late for the preliminary tabulation.

5. The Index Numbers.—The index numbers of employment and payrolls represent the percentage relationships between employees of establishments currently furnishing data and their aggregate weekly earnings, and the corresponding 1949 averages of these employees. The 1949 figures of employment and payrolls for firms which have since gone out of business are continued in the basic averages; firms or branches opening for business since 1949 are tabulated with zero base figures. The basic averages of establishments which operated in 1949 but have since been added to the mailing list, are incorporated in the base figures from the date when their co-operation was first obtained. The index numbers of average weekly wages and salaries relate the average earnings of persons employed by the reporting firms at a given date to the average earnings of their employees in 1949.

6. The Weekly Wages and Salaries.—The statistics of average weekly earnings result from the division of the aggregate weekly wages and salaries disbursed in the last pay periods in the month by the co-operating establishments, by the

number of their full time and part-time employees in the same periods. The figures represent gross earnings, before deductions are made for unemployment insurance contributions, taxes, etc. In addition to basic wages and salaries, the earnings include overtime payments, shift premiums, commissions, cost-of-living, incentive and production bonuses, and other bonuses paid at frequent intervals. They also include amounts paid employees absent on leave with pay during the reported pay periods, i.e., during vacations, statutory holidays, sick leave, etc.

The earnings do not include the value of free board and lodging and other perquisites, employers' contributions to welfare funds such as workmen's compensation, pension, and unemployment insurance funds and supplementary unemployment benefits. Also excluded are the cost to employers of certain other employee benefits, such as bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, (e.g., annual bonuses), and retirement gratuities.

The revised figures of earnings in the monthly reports incorporate retroactive pay for one month, corrections in the material originally tabulated, and data received too late for inclusion in the first tabulation; for the most part, such adjustments are not carried back for more than one month.


7. Hourly Earnings.—Statistics of average hourly and average hourly and weekly earnings of wage-earners for whom co-operating employers keep record of hours worked are contained in the monthly reports "Man-Hours and Hourly Earnings".

8. Urban Area Statistics.—Statistics given in the present report for communities listed as "metropolitan areas" and "other major urban areas" in Tables 8 and 9 of the 1956 Census Volume 1 (population) and in the same tables in Bulletin 1-6, cover the census areas, except those for St. Catharines, which also include establishments in Port Colborne and Welland, and those for Chicoutimi-Jonquiere which also include Bagotville and Port Alfred, as well as other smaller centres. Statistics given for urban areas not listed in the above mentioned tables cover establishments in the incorporated cities and towns named except for Galt, which include establishments in Preston as well as in Galt.

FOOTNOTES

Most of the footnotes are lists of names of industries that appear in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual which are grouped under special titles in employment and payroll publications. In some industries, the group breakdown shown in the tables is less extensive than in the Standard Industrial Classification; figures for the omitted categories however, are contained in the group totals.

- (a) **Gold mining** includes alluvial gold mining; auriferous quartz mining.
- (b) **Other metal mining** includes copper-gold-silver mining; iron mining; nickel-copper mining; silver-cobalt mining; silver-lead-zinc mining; miscellaneous metal mining.
- (c) **Non-metal mining** includes non-metal mining; quarrying, clay and sand pits.
- (d) **Other beverages** includes carbonated beverages; wines.
- (f) **Other leather products** includes leather gloves and mittens; leather tanneries; miscellaneous leather products.
- (g) **Saw and planing mills** includes plywood and veneer mills; sash, door and planing mills; sawmills.
- (h) **Other wood products** includes boxes and baskets (wood); morticians' goods; miscellaneous wood products.
- (i) **Other paper products** includes paper boxes and bags; roofing papers; miscellaneous paper products.
- (j) **Machinery manufacturing** includes household, office and store machinery; machine tools; machinery, n.e.c.
- (k) **Non-metallic mineral products** includes abrasive products; asbestos products; cement, hydraulic; clay products; glass and glass products; lime and gypsum products; stone products; concrete products; miscellaneous non-metallic mineral products.
- (l) **Other chemical products** includes explosives, ammunition and pyrotechnics; fertilizers; paints and varnishes; soaps, washing and cleaning compounds; toilet preparations; vegetable oil mills; primary plastics; miscellaneous chemical and allied products.
- (m) **Building** includes buildings and structures; special trade contractors. **General engineering** includes other construction, other than highways, bridges and streets.
- (n) **Water transportation** includes water transportation; services incidental to water transportation.
- (o) **Electric and motor transportation** includes bus and coach transportation-interurban; urban and suburban transportation systems; taxicab; truck transportation; services incidental to transportation; other transportation.
- (p) **Urban and interurban transportation** includes bus and coach transportation-interurban; urban and suburban transportation systems.
- (q) **Other public utilities** includes gas manufacture and distribution; water and sanitary services; other public utilities.
- (r) **Industrial Machinery** includes machine tools; machinery, n.e.c.
- (s) **Synthetic textiles and silk** includes synthetic filament yarn and staple fibre; spun yarn and fabric.
- (t) **Durable Goods Manufacturing** includes wood, iron and steel, transportation equipment, non-ferrous metal, electrical apparatus and supplies and non-metallic minerals. The **non-durable** group includes the remaining manufacturing industries.
- (u) **Service** includes hotels, restaurants, laundries, dry cleaning plants, business, recreational services and miscellaneous services. Government, community and health services are **not** covered.
- (v) **Estimates of coverage** are based on comparisons of data for 1951 with Population Census Statistics. For details, see notes on page 63.
- (w) **The Northwest Territories** with the exception of Baffin Island are included in Alberta, Baffin Island is included in Quebec. The **Yukon Territory** is included in British Columbia.



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
